The Oregon State Beavers will face in 1982-83 what may be the toughest schedule in the school's history. OSU will compete in the prestigious Giusti Tournament, host USC and UCLA and compete in the newly formed Northern Pacific Athletic Conference.

The Beavers were to have opened against the People's Republic of China, but the visitors cancelled late in October because of a change in travel plans. Instead, the Beavers have tentatively inked the national team of Taiwan for their Nov. 9 opener. This will be the first meeting between the two teams, but OSU coach Akí Hill is familiar with Taiwan—she coached on the U.S. junior national team in the Jones Cup in 1981 which was played in Taiwan. And the United States beat Taiwan in the semifinals.

Perennial powerhouses USC and UCLA will visit Gill Coliseum this season and the Beavers will host the OSU tournament. Oregon State's first six NorPac games will be at home, but five of the final six will be on the road.
