 Mary Paczesniak lettered in Volleyball and Tennis at Oregon State from 1968-1971 and is instrumental in working on special projects for Marshfield High School. She is active with the school by bringing honor and recognition to former female athletes who earned it and deserved it, and in many cases, didn't receive it as they competed pre-Title IX. Prior to retiring in 2003, she taught and coached in Rogue River, Ore., for 28 years after two years at Marshfield in Coos Bay, Ore. She has since moved back to Coos Bay.

ON THE FIELD

- Men's Basketball returns to Corvallis to close out the first half of Pac-10 play. OSU hosts USC Thursday night at 5:30 p.m. on FSN Northwest to open the weekend. The Beavers then host UCLA Saturday at 4:30 p.m., a game that will also be on FSN Northwest.
- Women's Basketball visits the Los Angeles schools this weekend. The Beavers play at USC Thursday night (7 p.m.) followed by a Saturday game at UCLA (2 p.m.). The games close out OSU's first half of Pac-10 play. After visiting UCLA, OSU will play at Cal State Bakersfield on Tuesday, Feb. 2 in the Beavers' last non-conference game of the regular season.
- Junior guard Talisa Rhea became the 16th player in Women's Basketball history to reach the 1,000-point mark, doing so against Stanford Thursday night. Rhea finished the weekend with 51 points combined against Stanford and California and has 1,044 for her career.
- · Sixth-ranked Gymnastics stays at home this weekend to take on Stanford and Seattle Pacific Friday night starting at 7 p.m. The Beavers are ranked No. 2 in the floor exercise.

- Gymnastics is coming off a 195.700-192.800 victory over Washington on Friday night. The Beavers remain unbeaten with the victory and swept the individual awards with Makayla Stambaugh collecting four individual titles including scoring a 39.500 in the all-around. Stambaugh was named the Pac-10's Gymnast of the Week on Monday.
- Wrestling competes Sunday at Arizona State in a meet that begins at 1 p.m. Wrestling's 15 dual meet wins is the most since the 2006-07 season (17-2) in head coach Jim Zalesky's first season. Pre-Zalesky, the last time the team hit 15 wins was 1990. The team is currently on a 14-meet win streak, tying the last longest set in 1986. The next longest streak was 17 in 1984.
- Twenty-second ranked Wrestling held its final home meet of the 2009-10 season on Sunday and defeated Nebraska, 32-7. The Beavers improved to 15-1 overall this season.
- · Swimming competes in two meets this weekend. The Beavers are at Washington State Friday night, then take the short trek to the University of Idaho on Saturday. The Beavers are coming off a 162-98 victory over Seattle last Friday, which was the team's senior day. Four seniors took home individual dual wins including two each by Brittney Iverson and Signe Larson.
- Women's Track is at the Washington Invitational in Seattle on Friday and Saturday.
- A new A.D. Report discussing football ticket prices will be posted early next week.
- Mike Riley (Football), Craig Robinson (Men's Basketball), Jacquizz Rodgers (Football), Jordan Poyer (Football) and Kate Lanz (Women's Basketball) have been nominated for Oregon Sports Awards -- the ceremony is Sunday night at Nike.
- · Former Beaver Kyle DeVan will start at RG for the Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.
- · Football's Sean Canfield is competing in this weekend's Senior Bowl in Alabama. Keaton Kristick played in last Saturday's East-West Shrine Game.
