The Game

Oregon State opens its 2010 campaign Friday night at Hawaii. The teams start at 8:35 p.m. PT (6:35 p.m. in Hawaii). It is the start of a four-game series.

Radio

The game will air live on the Beaver Sports Network, Beaver Nation Online (osubeavers.com). Jay Reese is behind the mic to call play-by-play. For more information on catching the Beavers on the radio, check osubeavers.com.

Last Season

Oregon State ended the 2009 season by going 37-19 and advancing to the championship game of the Fort Worth Regional. OSU went 15-12 in Pac-10 play, tying for third in league games. The Beavers went 17-5 at home and 8-10 in road games.

Season Opener

The game marks the 16th season opener for the Beavers under head coach Pat Casey, and the 15th time the club will open away from Goss Stadium. Oregon State is 9-6 in season openers under Casey but have lost the last two to SEC clubs, Vanderbilt (2008) and Tennessee (2009).

Rankings

Oregon State is ranked by all five major polls to start the season, continuing a recent trend. OSU has been ranked to start the season by a majority of the polls since 2006, the first year after the team's first trip to Omaha. OSU's average ranking to start the 2010 season is 17th.

No. 2 Program

Oregon State was ranked as the No. 2 program of the last decade in a poll by Baseball America. Pat Casey was named the top head coach and Jacoby Ellsbury was one of the three-best outfielders.

Notes Of Importance

- Oregon State returns 21 letterwinners from last season's club, six of whom are positional starters. Additionally, the Beavers return 10 pitchers, with four of them being starters in 2009.
- Oregon State welcomes 14 new players to the club this season, including eight from the high school level. Two - Andrew Susac and Tony Bryant - turned down contracts after being drafted by MLB clubs to join the Beavers.
- Oregon State pitchers finished with 16 quality starts in 2009, and the club returns pitchers who totaled 12 (75 percent) last season.
- The game Friday night is the 101st season opener in Oregon State baseball history. The Beavers are 70-30 all-time in season openers. They are 31-21 in games played away from Goss Stadium.
- OSU opens up on the islands for the second time since 2007 (Hawaii-Hilo).

MLB First-Year Player Draft

Waldron was a 32nd round selection in the 2007 MLB First-Year Player Draft by Florida.

2009 (Sophomore)

Went 6-4 in 16 appearances, including 14 starts ... Posted an ERA of 4.15 in 93 1/3 innings ... Struck out 70 while walking just 31 ... Took the loss against TCU after allowing nine hits and six runs in 4 1/3 innings (5/30) ... Finished the regular season by holding Stanford to five hits and two runs with five strikeouts in 6 2/3 innings (5/24) ... Won his fifth game of the season after scattering five hits and no runs in 7 1/3 innings against Oregon (5/19) ... Went a full nine against Gonzaga, scattering two hits and a run in a win (5/12) ... Took the loss after allowing 10 hits and six runs in five innings at UCLA (4/24) ... Picked up his first loss in more than a month despite allowing five hits and four runs over seven innings against USC (4/17) ... Did not figure in the decision after allowing 11 hits and five runs over six innings against Arizona (4/9) ... Worked 7 2/3 innings against California, allowing eight hits and four runs to pick up his third win of the season (4/3) ... Picked up his second straight win after allowing just one run and five hits over 7 1/3 innings against Oregon (3/27) ... Earned his first career Oregon State victory, going eight innings, allowing three hits and three walks while striking out six against Utah Valley (3/19) ... Took the loss after allowing eight hits and seven runs in five innings against Oklahoma State (3/6) ... Struck out six and allowed five hits and three runs but did not figure in the decision against Arizona State (2/28).

Pacific

Played one season for Pacific, located in Stockton, Calif. ... Went 3-7 in 2008, posting a 5.20 earned run average ... Started all 15 games he appeared in and worked a team-leading 91 2/3 innings ... Struck out 63 ... Appeared against Oregon State in the final game of the season, and limited the Beavers to just five hits and two runs over seven innings while striking out five.

Golden Sierra High

During his tenure at Golden Sierra, was a four-year all-league performer and two-time Most Valuable Player for the Grizzlies ... Was also named the Sacramento Player of the Year in 2007 ... Posted a 0.65 earned run average as a senior, allowing just seven earned runs in 76 innings ... Finished with 151 strikeouts to just 17 walks as a senior ... Offensively, as a senior, hit .530 with 12 doubles, two triples and two home runs ... Had a 7-2 record and 1.13 ERA as a junior.

Majoring in exercise and sports science ... Born in Carmichael, Calif., but considers Pilot Hill, Calif., his hometown ... Is the son of Kathy and Steve Waldron ... Has one brother, Nicholas, 24 ... Enjoys wakeboarding, camping and hunting in his spare time ... Favorite athlete is Josh Beckett ... Favorite TV show is House and favorite movie is We Own The Night ... Always listens to the same 10 songs on a playlist prior to warming up for a start ... First memory of Oregon State was playing the Beavers while at Pacific.
