### The Game

Oregon State and Florida Atlantic meet in the first game of the Gainesville Regional Friday. First pitch from McKethan Stadium is scheduled for 1 p.m. ET (10 a.m. PT).

### Last Game

Steve Selsky's sixth-inning home run proved to be the game winner as the Oregon State baseball team concluded its regular season with a 3-1 loss to Arizona Sunday in front of 2,823 fans at Goss Stadium. Selsky's home run was a two-run shot in the sixth that broke a 1-1 deadlock. It came off OSU reliever Tyler Waldron, who ended the weekend with 6 1/3 innings of work against Arizona, where he allowed just two hits and two runs with 10 strikeouts. Both hits and runs, however, came in Sunday's finale and sent Waldron to 4-5 this season.

### Back In The Postseason

The Beavers are back in the postseason for the second consecutive season and for the fifth time in the last six years, easily the program's best span of NCAA play.

### June

Even though the Beavers are in the postseason, it will be their first games in the month of June since the 2007 College World Series. No current OSU player has played a collegiate game during the month of June.

### Santos

Adalberto Santos enters Friday's contest by having reached base safely in 37 straight games.

## Notes Of Importance

- Oregon State will be playing its first games in the Eastern Time Zone this season. Oregon State did not play a game in the Central Time Zone, and had just three games in the Mountain Time Zone.
- The trip to Gainesville was approximately 3,000 miles for Oregon State. That, however, was not the longest trip for the club. The Beavers opened the 2010 season at Hawaii.
- Oregon State finished the regular season with an average home attendance of 2,090 over 31 dates, which put the Beavers 29th nationally and third among all Pac-10 clubs.
- Both Jared Norris and Andrew Susac have greatly improved their average since the start of May. Norris stood at .183 on May 10, and has since gone 13-for-38 (.342) over his last 11 games to improve it to .239.
- Susac was at .194 on April 30. He is 16-for-52 (.307) over his last 15 games to improve it to .261.
- OSU is 11-3 in one-run games in 2010.

#### 2009 Summer

Appeared in 10 games for Yarmouth-Dennis of the Cape Cod League, making five starts ... Posted a 3-2 record with a 2.75 ERA ... Worked 36 innings, striking out 35 ... Issued seven walks and allowed 34 hits ... Opponents batted .255 against him.

#### MLB First-Year Player Draft

Peavey was a 32nd round selection in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft by Houston ... He was also selected in the 24th round of the 2007 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees.

#### 2010 (Junior)

Threw a quality start against Arizona, allowing seven hits and three runs in 7 2/3 innings to get the win (5/28) ... Took the loss after allowing 13 hits and eight runs in six innings against Arizona State (5/21) ... Picked up his first win in a month after allowing six hits and four runs in 5 2/3 innings against Washington (5/14) ... Worked 7 1/3 innings, throwing a quality start after scattering five hits and a run with four strikeouts, but did not get the decision against Oregon (5/7) ... Took the loss after allowing 11 hits and seven earned runs over 5 2/3 innings at California (4/30) ... Threw a quality start, but took the loss after allowing nine hits and three earned runs in seven innings against Washington State (4/23) ... Allowed 10 hits and five runs in 6 1/3 innings against Stanford but did not earn a decision (4/16) ... Threw his second complete game of the season, scattering just two hits and a run while striking out six to get the win against No. 3 UCLA (4/9) ... Went seven full innings against USC, but did not pick up the decision after allowing three hits, a run, three walks and 10 strikeouts (4/1) ... Scattered four hits and a run in 4 2/3 innings against Long Beach State, but was removed before earning the win due to a rain delay (3/26) ... Picked up his second win after limiting Maine to six hits and two runs over six innings (3/19) ... Allowed five hits and four runs over 6 1/3 innings against Utah but did not get the decision (3/13) ... Threw his first career complete-game shutout, holding Tennessee to three hits while striking out nine for the win (2/28) ... Limited Hawaii to four hits and three runs over 5.0 innings, but did not get the decision (2/21).

#### Hudson's Bay High

Lettered four years for head coach Steve Stebbins ... picked by the New York Yankees in the 24th round of the 2007 MLB Draft but did not sign ... selected to play in 2006 Aflac All-American High School Baseball Classic ... ranked No. 17 among nation's top 300 players in high school class of 2007 by Baseball America magazine ... ranked No. 1 among Washington's top 75 players in high school class of 2007 by Baseball Northwest ... ranked No. 34 among 2007 Major League Baseball Draft Top 50 Prospects (high school and college) by Baseball America magazine ... as a junior, was all-state first team and all-league first team ... finished 9-0 with one save, a 0.54 ERA, 65 innings pitched, 26 hits, 10 walks, 112 strikeouts and batted .388 with 26 RBIs ... as a sophomore, posted a 5-0 record with a 1.88 ERA in one-half season ... as a freshman, was 7-1 with a 2.13 ERA, 49 innings pitched and 64 strikeouts ... batted .422 with 20 RBI.
