2010 Oregon State Regional Notes

Beavers In A Regional Again

Oregon State will be making its fifth trip to an NCAA Regional in six years when the Beavers head to Gainesville to play host Florida, Florida Atlantic and Bethune-Cookman. Oregon State eventually advanced to the College World Series from 2005-07 and earned titles in 2006 and 2007, becoming just the fifth NCAA program to win back-to-back championships.

Postseason History

Oregon State is making its 11th trip to an NCAA Regional dating back to 1952. The Beavers are 34-20 (.629) in NCAA Tournament games, including a mark of 17-13 (.567) in regional games. Head coach Pat Casey has a 29-8 (.783) record in NCAA games and has gone 12-3 (.750) in NCAA Regional contests.

Regional Experience

Of the 35 players on the Oregon State active roster, 15 have NCAA Regional experience, with each of those 15 players earning that experience at the Fort Worth Regional last season. Rob Folsom was with the Beavers in 2005 during their College World Series season, and di make the trip to Omaha but did not play.

Against The Other Clubs

Oregon State is unfamiliar with its clubs at the regional. The Beavers have never played Florida or Bethune-Cookman, and have just one previous game against Florida Atlantic, defeating the Owls, 13-5, in 1998 at a neutral-site game in Melbourne, Fla.

On The Road

Oregon State has played 21 games away from its home ballpark, Goss Stadium, this season. The Beavers are 10-11 in such games this season, posting a 7-10 mark in true road games.

Non-Conference Tilts

With Pacific-10 Conference play officially over and the NCAA Tournament at hand, it's important to take a look at the Beavers' non-conference record. Oregon State went 19-7 in non-conference games this season.

Keeping Opponents Down

Oregon State played a number of close games this season, and limited opponents to five runs or less in 35 of its 53 games. The Beavers were 28-7 this season when opponents scored five or less. Comparatively, OSU was held to five or less in 32 games. The Beavers were 12-20 this season when that happened.

And That Brings Us To One-Run Games

OSU was certainly disappointed in its 7-9 record in one-run games in 2009, and did everything it could to flip that number around this season. That it did. The Beavers were 11-3 in one-run games in 2010, and 7-1 at home.

He Hits It Hard And Deep

The Beavers hit 23 home runs as a club in 2009, finishing near the bottom of the Pac-10. Just like their one-run tally, that number changed dramatically this season as Oregon State finished with 42 in 2010, placing the Beavers fourth in the league at the completion of the regular season.

Tale Of Three Seasons

Oregon State had three distinct parts to its regular season, evidenced greatly by its win-loss record over each stretch. OSU started off its 2010 campaign with a 16-3 record. The Beavers then went 1-11 over its next 12 games before seemingly salvaging the year with a 10-5 record over the last 15. During that 15-game stretch, the Beavers won seven games against teams with top 50 RPIs - all of whom qualified for the postseason.

Robles And Peavey Lower Their ERAs

Tanner Robles and Greg Peavey played significant roles on the OSU starting staff in 2010, and their efforts certainly affected their statistics. Robles came into the season with two individual season earned run averages above 4.50 and lowered iot to 3.43 in 76 innings this season. Peavey, meanwhile, went through most of the season as OSU's Friday-night starter and went 5-3 with an ERA of 3.69. His best single-season ERA prior to the season was 4.96 in 2008. Peavey earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors twice while Robles was named to the honor once.

As Santos Goes ...

Adalberto Santos had a 12-game hit streak late in the year that saw the outfielder bat .471 (23-for-53) with five home runs. That was snapped May 29 against Arizona, but he managed to walk and score a run in the game. That enabled him to end the year by reaching safely in 37 straight.
