## 2010 (Junior)

Named Pacific-10 Conference Pitcher of the Week March 1 and April 12 ... All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention USA Baseball Golden Spikes Spotlight Player of the Week (March 1) ... Made 15 appearances, all starts, and went 6-3 with a 3.64 ERA in 99 innings ... Earned the win after going 6 1/3 against Florida Atlantic in the Gainesville Regional (6/4) ... Threw a quality start against Arizona, allowing seven hits and three runs in 7 2/3 innings to get the win (5/28) ... Took the loss after allowing 13 hits and eight runs in six innings against Arizona State (5/21) ... Picked up his first win in a month after allowing six hits and four runs in 5 2/3 innings against Washington (5/14) ... Worked 7 1/3 innings, throwing a quality start after scattering five hits and a run with four strikeouts, but did not get the decision against Oregon (5/7) ... Took the loss after allowing 11 hits and seven earned runs over 5 2/3 innings at California (4/30) ... Threw a quality start, but took the loss after allowing nine hits and three earned runs in seven innings against Washington State (4/23) ... Allowed 10 hits and five runs in 6 1/3 innings against Stanford but did not earn a decision (4/16) ... Threw his second complete game of the season, scattering just two hits and a run while striking out six to get the win against No. 3 UCLA (4/9) ... Went seven full innings against USC, but did not pick up the decision after allowing three hits, a run, three walks and 10 strikeouts (4/1) ... Scattered four hits and a run in 4 2/3 innings against Long Beach State, but was removed before earning the win due to a rain delay (3/26) ... Picked up his second win after limiting Maine to six hits and two runs over six innings (3/19) ... Allowed five hits and four runs over 6 1/3 innings against Utah but did not get the decision (3/13) ... Threw his first career complete-game shutout, holding Tennessee to three hits while striking out nine for the win (2/28) ... Limited Hawaii to four hits and three runs over 5.0 innings, but did not get the decision (2/21).

## 2009 (Sophomore)

Appeared in 13 games, with 12 starts ... Went 4-3 with a 5.74 ERA, striking out 42 in 62 2/3 innings ... Won his fourth game of the season after scattering six hits and four runs over 6 1/3 innings against Oregon (5/20) ... Lost after allowing seven hits and nine runs over 1 2/3 innings at Washington (5/9) ... Took a no decision after going four innings against Arizona State (5/2) ... Did not figure in the decision after going 4 2/3 at UCLA (4/25) ... Did not get the decision after scattering five hits and two runs while striking out six in 7 1/3 against USC (4/18) ... Lost for the first time in a month after allowing seven hits and six runs in three innings at Arizona (4/10) ... Earned his third win of the 2009 season after striking out seven and scattering four hits and two runs in a career-long seven-inning outing against California (4/4) ... Picked up his second win of the season after allowing four hits and three runs - all unearned - in six innings against Saint Mary's (3/21) ... Took the loss after allowing three runs and five hits while striking out seven in 5 2/3 innings against Missouri State (3/14) ... Allowed seven hits and five runs against San Francisco (3/13) ... Scattered seven hits and three runs over 5 1/3 innings against Northern Illinois to pick up his first win of the season (2/26).

## 2008 (Freshman)

Made 15 appearances, including five starts, and went 2-3 with a 4.96 ERA

... Worked 49 full innings, striking out 35 ... Opponents hit .266 against him ... Made eight appearances and one start in Pac-10 games and was 1-1 with a 4.56 ERA ... Made the last start of the season for OSU, his fifth, going 5 1/3, allowing six hits with five strikeouts, against Pacific (5/25), but he did not get the decision ... Started his fourth game of the season and scattered four hits and two runs over 5 1/3 innings in the series finale against USC (5/18) ... Took the loss after working 5 2/3 innings in relief, striking out two while allowing seven hits and five runs against UCLA (5/10) ... Worked 6 2/3 innings in relief, allowing six hits and two runs while striking out two against Washington State (5/4) ... Took the loss but pitched effectively, allowing four hits and an earned run in 4 1/3 innings against Gonzaga (4/30) ... Picked up the win after striking out one for his only at bat faced against Arizona State (4/18) ... Worked one full inning, allowing two hits against Stanford (4/13) ... Allowed one hit and one earned in one inning against Stanford (4/12) ... Worked a solid three innings, striking out three and walking one, for his first career save in the first game of a doubleheader against Washington (3/29) ... Picked up his first career win, throwing 5 1/3 innings in relief against Pepperdine (3/21) ... Allowed two hits and seven runs against Santa Clara (3/9) ... Struck out seven in 6 2/3 innings against Georgia (3/2) ... Made his collegiate debut against Arizona State, lasting 1/3 of an inning, scattering seven runs and four hits (2/24).

## Hudson's Bay High

Lettered four years for head coach Steve Stebbins ... picked by the New York Yankees in the 24th round of the 2007 MLB Draft but did not sign ... selected to play in 2006 Aflac All-American High School Baseball Classic ... ranked No. 17 among nation's top 300 players in high school class of 2007 by Baseball America magazine ... ranked No. 1 among Washington's top 75 players in high school class of 2007 by Baseball Northwest ... ranked No. 34 among 2007 Major League Baseball Draft Top 50 Prospects (high school and college) by Baseball America magazine ... as a junior, was all-state first team and all-league first team ... finished 9-0 with one save, a 0.54 ERA, 65 innings pitched, 26 hits, 10 walks, 112 strikeouts and batted .388 with 26 RBIs ... as a sophomore, posted a 5-0 record with a 1.88 ERA in one-half season ... as a freshman, was 7-1 with a 2.13 ERA, 49 innings pitched and 64 strikeouts ... batted .422 with 20 RBI.
