2010 (Junior)

Made 26 appearances, including one start ... Was 1-2 with a 3.89 ERA in 37 innings ... Picked up save No. 3 after holding Arizona State to two hits and no runs in 2 1/3 innings (5/23) ... Made his first career start and took the loss despite allowing five hits and two runs in 5 2/3 innings against San Diego (5/10) ... Needed just nine pitches to finish 1 1/3 innings of perfect relief against Washington State (4/25) ... Picked up save No. 2 after getting out of a bases-loaded jam in the ninth against USC (4/3) ... Worked 1 2/3 scoreless innings of relief against USC (4/1) ... Threw just one pitch and got the save against Maine (3/21) ... Struck out three and allowed just one hit in 2 1/3 scoreless innings of relief against Portland (3/14) ... Came on in relief against Hawaii in the season opener, and picked up the win after striking out two in 2 1/3 innings (2/19).

2009 (Sophomore)

Made 26 appearances, going 1-3 with a 4.05 ERA ... Worked 20 innings with a save ... Recorded two outs in the eighth inning against Texas A&M (5/29) ... Needed two pitches to get an inning-ending double play in an outing against Oregon (5/19) ... Held Washington State scoreless over 1 1/3 innings while striking out three (5/16) ... Picked up win No. 1 of the season after allowing one earned run with a strikeout in 1 1/3 innings against Arizona State (5/2) ... Worked two scoreless innings in the series finale win over USC, striking out two while walking one (4/19) ... Kept California off the basepaths in two innings while striking out two (4/4) ... Earned his first career save against Oregon after going 1 2/3 innings, allowing no baserunners and striking out four (3/27) ... Worked a full inning against Saint Mary's, striking out one (3/22) ... Threw just two pitches against Texas Tech but got out of a bases-loaded jam in the eighth (3/8) ... truck out two and walked one in an inning against Missouri (2/27).

2008 (Freshman)

Appeared in 22 games, posting a 2-0 record and 3.91 ERA ... Worked 25 1/3 innings, scattering 26 hits and 11 earned runs ... Struck out 23 ... Inherited 33 runners, allowing just eight to score (24 percent) ... Stranded his last 12 inherited runners straight ... Was 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA in eight Pac-10 appearances ... Came and in and worked two innings of relief against USC, allowing just a hit and an unearned run (5/17) ... Worked an inning of relief against UCLA, striking out one (5/11) ... Picked up his first career win after throwing 2 1/3 innings, retiring all seven batters he faced, while striking out three against Stanford (4/11) ... Came on in relief and didn't allow a baserunner, striking out two against Washington (3/30) ... Threw in long relief against BYU, throwing two innings in Provo (3/24) ... Threw a near-flawless two innings against Pepperdine, scattering two hits while walking one (3/22) ... Worked 4 1/3 innings against Georgia, striking out four while scattering three hits and two runs (3/1) ... Threw 2 full innings against Arizona State, scattering one hit while striking out two ... Worked out of a jam in 0.1 innings against Vanderbilt, forcing the only batter he faced into an inning-ending fielder's choice (2/22).
