

2009-10: Senior post player who will compete for significant playing time ... Entering his senior season healthy after battling numerous injuries throughout his career.

2008-09: Played in 30 contests as a junior ... Averaged 5.3 minutes, 1.1 points and 0.6 rebounds per game ... Scored a season-high five points against Yale ... Scored four points while playing nine minutes in a key second-half stretch in the home victory over California ... Recorded a season-high two assists in the win over Howard ... Played at least 10 minutes on six separate occasions.

2007-08: Played in 29 contests on the season while starting nine as a sophomore ... Averaged 12.7 minutes, 3.3 points and 2.7 rebounds ... All totals were career marks ... Scored a career-high 16 points at Washington while going 5-of-7 from the field ... Went a perfect 5-of-5 from the field at Oregon while scoring 10 points ... Posted a career-high total with eight rebounds in games against Iowa State and Washington ... Totaled at least five rebounds on seven different occasions ... Recorded a season-high two blocks against USC ... Scored eight points in the win against USC Upstate and at Cal ... Registered a career-high two steals in the game at home against Washington.





2009-10: Powerful guard who is the leading returning scorer for Oregon State ... Explosive player who has the highest vertical jump on the team ... Has been mentioned as a possible all-conference selection in various preseason publications ... Enters the season healthy after battling hand and knee injuries towards the end of his sophomore year.

2008-09: Played in 30 games as a sophomore, starting five ... Averaged 29.7 minutes, 13.0 points (led team), 3.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.0 steals per game ... Led team with 13.2 points per game in Pac-10 games ... Scored in double figures in 20 games and scored 20-plus points on four occasions, both team highs ... Set a career high with 25 points at Stanford ... Scored 20 points in a win over Seattle Pacific ... Tallied 24 points in a win over Seattle ... Scored 21 in a win at California ...
