



GAME 1 — OREGON STATE VS. SACRAMENTO STATE

CORVALLIS — Freshman running back **Malcolm Agnew** made perhaps the best debut in the history of the Oregon State program in the Beavers' 2011 opener against Sacramento State.

The diminutive back from Chesterfield, Mo., rushed for 223 yards and three touchdowns, but it wasn't enough to carry the Beavers to a victory in a 29-28 loss in overtime to the Hornets.

Agnew's 223 yards rushing was the ninth-best single-game total in Oregon State history and his three touchdown rushes helped the Beavers come from a 21-6 deficit to even the score midway through the fourth quarter.

Agnew scored his first touchdown at the 12:44 mark of the fourth quarter, then pulled the Beavers to within two on a 4-yard touchdown carry less than five minutes later. **Sean Mannion**, also appearing in his first career game, found **Markus Wheaton** in the end zone on a two-point conversion to tie the game.

OSU threatened late in the fourth quarter, but a 27-yard field goal attempt by **Trevor Romaine** hit the right upright as time expired, forcing the seventh overtime game in Oregon State's history.

Agnew continued his hot day in the Beavers' only overtime period, gaining all of the Beavers' 25 yards. First, he ran for an 8-yard gain, then went up the middle for a 17-yard score.

The Hornets, however, answered with a scoring drive of their own as quarterback Jeff Fleming found Brandyn Reed on a 6-yard touchdown strike. Sacramento State, which was playing a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent for the 10th consecutive season, went for two after an Oregon State timeout.

Fleming tossed a fade to the right side of the end zone, finding Reed again for the two-point conversion and the victory.

Agnew was one of the eight true freshmen to play, and became the first to start a season opener at running back.

Mannion, in relief of **Ryan Katz** to start the second half, made his biggest throw of the afternoon on a 69-yarder to Wheaton in the fourth quarter that eventually led to Agnew's second rushing touchdown of the game.

GAME 2 — OREGON STATE AT WISCONSIN

MADISON, Wis. - Sean Mannion threw for 244 yards with **Jordan Bishop** accounted for a career-best 98 but the Beavers dropped a 35-0 decision to No. 8 Wisconsin at Camp Randall Stadium.

Mannion finished the game 25-of-38 in the most action he has seen in two seasons - one redshirt year - at Oregon State. Five of his 25 passes went to Bishop, whose 98 yards receiving surpassed his previous high of 86 against Arizona State in 2010.

The quarterback also found **Markus Wheaton** for 83 yards on eight receptions, but the Beavers failed to find the end zone.

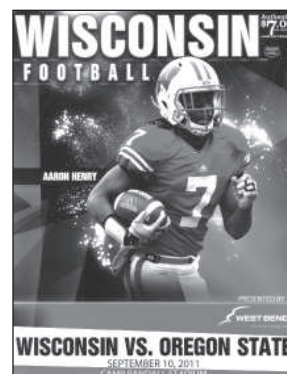
The Beavers' defense remained stout throughout the first half; the Badgers managed just three yards rushing in the first quarter and 82 entering halftime en route to a 21-0 lead.

Conversely, however, Wisconsin allowed the Beavers just 23 yards rushing, with **Jordan Jenkins** taking the team lead at 20.

Feti 'Unga led the Beavers with nine tackles, while **Anthony Watkins** and **Lance Mitchell** posted seven apiece. **Rusty Fernando** recorded his first career sack in the loss.

Russell Wilson was 17-of-21 for 189 yards and three touchdown strikes for Wisconsin. Two of his touchdown passes went to Jacob Pedersen, who led the Badgers with 80 yards receiving. Nick Toon caught a third and finished with 69 yards overall.

Montee Ball, who had 118 yards rushing, scored two touchdowns on the ground, both in the second half, to cap off Wisconsin's offensive afternoon.

GAME 3 — OREGON STATE VS. UCLA

CORVALLIS, Ore. — Sean Mannion passed for 287 yards and a touchdown in his first career start and James Rodgers made his 2011 debut with five receptions but the Beavers could not overcome an early deficit in a 27-19 loss to UCLA in the Pac-12 opener for both teams at Reser Stadium.

Mannion passed for his first career touchdown in the third quarter when he found Jordan Bishop on a 45-yarder where the wide receiver tight-roped the sideline for the score. However, a subsequent two-point conversion attempt, which would have tied the score at 21, was thwarted by the Bruins.

That play was the last chance at the end zone for the Beavers, who gave up a 1-yard touchdown run to UCLA's Anthony Barr with 6:15 remaining in the fourth quarter. The point after was blocked by Andrew Seumalo — his second of the day after a block on a 39-yard field goal attempt tying the school record — leaving the Beavers down eight with half the quarter to go.

OSU drove deep into UCLA territory but a fourth-down pass to Rodgers with less than three minutes remaining was broken up, effectively giving UCLA (2-2, 1-0 Pac-12) the win.

Rodgers made his debut after sitting out the first two games of the season due to rehabilitation for an injury suffered in 2010. His first reception of the year was a 31-yarder from Mannion in the first quarter that helped set up an eventual 25-yard field goal by Trevor Romaine.

Rodgers finished the game with 76 yards, second only to Markus Wheaton, who ended the day with eight catches for 83 yards. Bishop, whose 45-yard touchdown catch was the longest reception of his career, finished with 69 yards on three receptions.

Mannion ended the game 24-for-40. He played the entire game after coming off the bench in the first two games. Grant Enger joined him as a new starter at left guard, giving the Beavers 17 players who made their first career starts in the young season.

The Beavers (0-3, 0-1) fell behind 21-3 after three consecutive touchdowns, the second two coming in the second quarter.

But Jordan Poyer proceeded to energize the nearly 45,000 in attendance at Reser with an 85-yard punt return for touchdown with just 13 seconds remaining in the second quarter. He took the punt at OSU's 15, went up the middle and found himself down the left side of the field untouched for the score. It was the second-longest punt return in Oregon State history and earned him Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week.

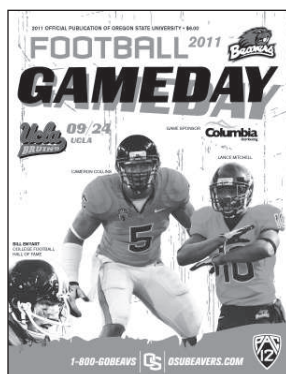

GAME 4 — OREGON STATE AT ARIZONA STATE

TEMPE, Ariz. — Sean Mannion set an Oregon State single-game record with 40 pass completions in 66 attempts, throwing for 341 yards in the process, but the Beavers dropped a 35-20 decision to Arizona State at Sun Devil Stadium.

Mannion surpassed Erik Wilhelm's 39-for-64 effort in 1986 against Michigan that previously sat in the Oregon State record books. He threw for more than 200 yards for the third consecutive game.

For the second consecutive game, he threw a touchdown strike, this time to senior James Rodgers on a 5-yard pass in the third quarter. It was Rodgers' first score of the season and 17th of his career through the air, moving him one shy of tying Robb Thomas for fourth in team history.

Terron Ward, who scampered in on a 10-yard rush, held Oregon State's other touchdown, it coming in the first half as the Beavers rushed out to a 13-0 lead. It was the first score of Ward's young career.

Oregon State's Jordan Poyer grabbed two interceptions and Anthony Watkins had a third for the Beavers as OSU forced four Arizona State turnovers. It was the most since Oregon State forced both UCLA and Washington into four turnovers in 2008.

Arizona State, down 13-0 entering the second quarter, scored the next 21 points to take an eight-point advantage over the Beavers. Oregon State had jumped out to a 6-0 lead on field goals by Trevor Romaine, and then a 13-0 lead on Ward's 10-yard run.

But Arizona State quarterback Brock Osweiler broke up Oregon State's scoring with a 17-yard pass to A.J. Pickens early in the second quarter. Five minutes later, he connected on a 24-yard touchdown strike to Gerrell Robinson that put the Sun Devils up for good.

Rodgers' first score of the season pulled OSU to within one, 21-20, early in the third quarter. The Beavers, however, were unable to keep Arizona State off the board from that point on, with running back Cameron Marshall scoring on consecutive runs in the third and fourth quarters, to bring the game to its final 35-20 tally.

Markus Wheaton was Mannion's favorite receiver, leading the Beavers with 11 receptions for 116 yards. All told, of Mannion's 40 pass completions, at least two went to nine different receivers.

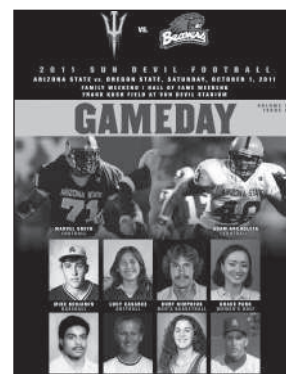

GAME 5 — OREGON STATE VS. ARIZONA

ARIZONA 27

CORVALLIS, Ore. — Sean Mannion threw for 267 yards and two touchdowns and Jovan Stevenson rushed for a career-high 99 yards and a score as the Oregon State football team defeated Arizona, 37-27, at Reser Stadium.

Lance Mitchell had a fumble recovery, interception and pass breakup to pace the Oregon State defense as the Beavers snapped a four-game losing streak to improve to 1-4 on the year and send Arizona to a 1-5 record.

The Oregon State defense held on after the OSU offense helped pace the Beavers to a 27-6 lead entering halftime. The Beavers scored 27 points in the second quarter on two field goals by Trevor Romaine, a 1-yard score by Stevenson, a punt block for touchdown by Clayton York and a 3-yard touchdown reception by Joe Halahuni.

It all combined to help the Beavers get their first victory of the season.

The 27 second-quarter points were the most in a quarter for the Beavers since they posted 28 in the second quarter against Arizona in 2003. It came after a scoreless first quarter and proved to be hugely beneficial as Arizona outscored Oregon State, 21-10, in the second half.

The Wildcats pulled to within three, 30-27, late in the fourth quarter, threatening to take the lead. But Mannion connected with Halahuni for the tight end's second score of the game on a 2-yard touchdown with 4:05 remaining in the game.

Arizona and quarterback Nick Foles had two consecutive drives stopped deep in Oregon State territory late in the fourth quarter. Foles had 378 yards passing, but was able to throw for just one score in the loss.

Mannion, meanwhile, threw for more than 200 yards for his fourth consecutive game, accomplishing a feat achieved by Sean Canfield, Matt Moore, Derek Anderson and Jonathan Smith over the last decade.

Mannion completed 32-of-41 passes attempted, with a team-high six going to Markus Wheaton, upping his total to 38 this season. Stevenson, Halahuni and Jordan Jenkins all had five for OSU.

While Foles threw for 378 yards, he was also picked off twice, once by Mitchell and another by Michael Doctor, who recorded his first career interception. The Beavers also managed eight pass breakups, including a game-high four for Jordan Poyer, who also led Oregon State with eight tackles.

The Beavers also kept their pressure on Foles and the Arizona running game. OSU tallied four tackles for loss, forced a fumble and recovered two fumbles. Arizona's leading rusher was Keola Antolin, who, while tallying one rushing score, only carried the ball six times for 28 yards.

CORVALLIS, Ore. — Jordan Poyer returned an interception for touchdown and Sean Mannion passed for 306 yards but it wasn't enough to overcome BYU as the Beavers dropped a 38-28 decision to the Cougars at Reser Stadium.

Poyer picked off a Riley Nelson pass with 1:18 remaining in the first half and returned it 51 yards for his second career defensive score. It tied the game at 14 after the Cougars had gone up 14-0 to start the game.

Poyer ended the game with the interception — tying him for the Pac-12 Conference lead — and two pass breakups in addition to 171 yards on seven kick returns. His effort, however, wasn't enough to help the Beavers overcome 24 second-half points by BYU to just 14 for the Beavers.

Mannion threw for 306 yards — his highest single-game total at Reser Stadium — and capped off his afternoon with a 59-yard pass to Brandin Cooks that pulled the Beavers to within three, 24-21, with two minutes remaining in the third quarter.

Mannion ended the day 27-for-43 with one score and two interceptions.

BYU scored 14 consecutive points after Mannion found Cooks. The Cougars opened the fourth quarter with a 2-yard pass from Nelson to JD Falslev that made it 31-21. Seven minutes later, Nelson threw another pass, this one 8 yards to Kaneakua Friel for the 38-21 advantage.

OSU (1-5 overall) added a final touchdown with 23 seconds remaining when Jovan Stevenson found the end zone.

Nelson ended the afternoon passing for 217 yards and three touchdowns, finishing 17-for-27. He also led the Cougars (5-2) in rushing with 87 yards on 12 attempts.

Cody Hoffman caught nine passes for 162 yards to lead all receivers; Markus Wheaton was tops on the Beavers with eight pass receptions for 104 yards.

Neither team was particularly fine offensively. The Beavers committed four turnovers — two via interceptions and two via fumbles. BYU, meanwhile, threw an interception and fumbled the ball twice, one of which was recovered by the Beavers. Scott Crichton cradled that fumble for the first recovery of his career.

Oregon State also managed its fifth block on a field goal attempt of the season as Crichton managed to get a hand on a 50-yard attempt. The blocked kick was eventually returned by Anthony Watkins 60 yards to the BYU 30 as time expired in the first half.

SEATTLE — Sean Mannion threw for four touchdowns, Malcolm Agnew rushed for 104 yards and a score and Markus Wheaton grabbed 99 yards through the air as the Beavers defeated Washington State, 44-21, at CenturyLink Field.

The Beavers were prolific offensively, finishing with 551 yards of total offense, the most since posting 567 at Washington State in 2009. Mannion provided a majority of the offense, completing 26-of-34 passes for 376 yards — his sixth consecutive game with more than 200 yard through the air.

He completed touchdown passes of 31 yards to Jordan Jenkins and 12 yards to Brandin Cooks in the first half as the Beavers jumped out to a 24-14 advantage at the break.

Agnew, who rushed for more than 100 yards for the second time this season, also scored on a 3-yard rush during the half, his fourth carry of the season to reach the end zone, leading the Beavers.

Oregon State (2-5 overall, 2-2 Pac-12) did not let up in the second half as Mannion threw two more touchdown strikes — 25 yards to Joe Halahuni and 18 yards to Clayton York. OSU out-scored the Cougars (3-4, 1-3) 20-7 during the second half.

The Beavers' 44 points was the most in a game since Oregon State tallied 42 at Washington State in 2009. Defensively, the Beavers were also stout, allowing just a little more than 300 yards of total offense, including 83 on the ground. Dylan Wynn recovered two fumbles, giving him five on the year, a new Oregon State single-season record.

Scott Crichton forced both of Wynn's fumble recoveries and OSU finished with four sacks, tying a single-game high for the season. Taylor Henry had his first career multi-sack game with two.

Wheaton was tops amongst the game's receivers with five catches for 99 yards, just shy of reaching the 100-yard plateau for the fourth time this season. All told, Mannion found 11 different receivers in the win.

Mannion found Jenkins on a 31-yard swing pass for the game's first score seven minutes in, and the Beavers jumped out to a 21-14 lead after Cooks' score and Agnew's rushing touchdown.

Trevor Romaine closed out the game's offense in the first half with a 26-yard field goal for the Beavers' 10-point lead.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah — Markus Wheaton caught his first touchdown pass of the season and Sean Mannion surpassed 200 yards passing for the seventh straight game but the Beavers dropped a 27-8 decision to Utah at Rice-Eccles Stadium.

Wheaton caught six passes on the day and Mannion found him in the end zone early in the fourth quarter for a 3-yard score. Wheaton had come into the game with a team-leading 51 receptions but no touchdowns.

Mannion attempted 49 passes, completing 27, and finished with 231 yards passing. Only he, Sean Canfield (2009) and Derek Anderson (13 games in 2003) have thrown for 200 or more yards in seven straight games over the last decade.

Mannion, however, was picked off three times and sacked six times. The Utes also forced two fumbles, recovering one.

The Beavers were forced to punt six times with Johnny Hekker tallying 315 yards. He pinned the Utes inside the 20 three times, had four punts of more than 50 yards and in the process broke the OSU single-game record for average yards at 52.5. He broke Dainard Paulson's previous record of 51.2 set in 1959 against Oregon.

Wheaton's score got the Beavers on the board and less than three minutes later, OSU (2-6 overall, 2-3 Pac-12) was granted two points on a safety when a Utah offensive lineman was found to be holding in the end zone.

Those eight points, however, were not enough to overcome a 24-point deficit to Utah (4-4, 1-4). The Utes led 3-0 after the first quarter and scored 21 points in the second quarter.

Utah quarterback Jon Hays passed for 62 yards and completed 6-of-14 passes attempted. Two went for touchdowns in the second quarter — a 35-yarder to Dres Anderson and a 3-yarder to DeVonte Christopher.

Sandwiched in between the two passing scores was a 6-yard touchdown rush by John White. The running back finished the game with 205 yards rushing on 35 carries.

James Rodgers surpassed the 200 catch mark for his career with seven against Utah. He now has 206 for his career and is one of three Oregon State players in history to reach the 200-catch plateau.

Brandin Cooks, set a single-game career record with five receptions, and Jordan Bishop added five catches for the Beavers in the loss.

CORVALLIS, Ore. — James Rodgers caught six passes, including his 18th career for touchdown, in Oregon State's 38-13 loss to third-ranked Stanford at Reser Stadium.

His six receptions gave him 212 for his career, one shy of tying James Newson for second-most at Oregon State and eight behind record-holder Mike Hass. His second-quarter score came from 15 yards out and cut Stanford's lead to 14-7 with 5:25 to play in the half.

Rodgers' score was redshirt freshman quarterback **Sean Mannion's** 11th touchdown pass of the season as the Pleasanton, Calif., native was 18-of-30 on the day. He threw for 252 yards in the loss, marking his eighth consecutive game with at least 200 yards passing. Only Derek Anderson (13 straight in 2003) can claim a longer streak than Mannion over the last decade.

The Beavers maintained a close game until the third quarter as the Cardinal led 17-7 at halftime. But Oregon State ran just 21 plays in the second half — finishing with 47 overall — and Stanford out-scored the Beavers 21-6 in the half.

Andrew Luck passed for 206 yards and three touchdowns and Stepfan Taylor rushed for 95 yards in the win for Stanford, which improved to 9-0 overall and 7-0 in Pac-12 Conference play. The Beavers, meanwhile, dropped to 2-7 overall and 2-4 in Pac-12 games.

The Cardinal took a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter after being held scoreless in the first quarter — the Beavers being the only team this season to hold Stanford scoreless this season. But Jeremy Stewart opened the game's scoring with a 2-yard rush three seconds into the second quarter.

Luck extended Stanford's lead to 14-0 when he found Griff Whalen on a 17-yard pass at the 7:51 mark.

Oregon State answered with Mannion's 15-yard touchdown pass to Rodgers less than three minutes later.

Stanford made it 17-7 with 35 seconds remaining in the first half when Eric Whitaker nailed a 31-yard field goal. OSU had an opportunity to make it 17-10 but a 50-yard field goal attempt by Trevor Romaine was blocked with seven seconds remaining.

That did little to deter the Beavers early in the second half as **Malcolm Agnew** scored his fifth touchdown of the season on a 2-yard carry. It came at the 11:53 mark but was the last score of the day for OSU as the point after touchdown was blocked and the Cardinal scored the game's last 21 points.

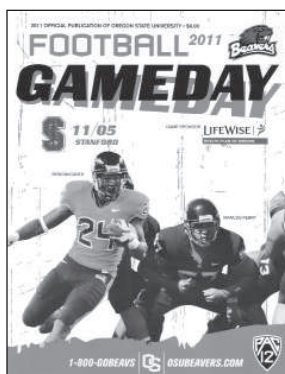

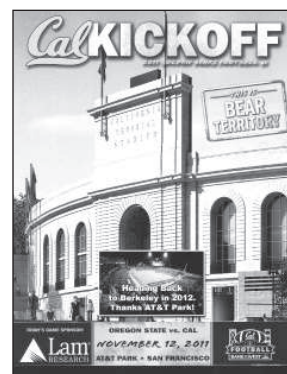

CORVALLIS, Ore. — It was a big day for **James Rodgers**, **Jovan Stevenson**, **Sean Mannion** and the 17 Beaver seniors who were playing their final games at Reser Stadium as members of the Oregon State football team.

Rodgers caught four passes to become Oregon State's career receptions leader, and Mannion and Stevenson had big afternoons as the Beavers defeated Washington, 38-21, on Senior Day at Reser Stadium.

Rodgers surpassed Mike Hass with 222 catches, two more than the former record holder. One of his four catches went for a 6-yard touchdown in the first quarter as the Beavers went into the first break of the game with a 14-7 lead.

Stevenson, meanwhile, scored the game's final three touchdowns — all in the fourth quarter — as the Beavers shut down Washington's offense in the second half and salted the game away with an offense that moved the ball generously in the second half. The touchdowns were the third, fourth and fifth of the season, as he joined **Malcolm Agnew** as Beavers with three scores in a game to that point in the season.

Stevenson didn't lead the Beavers in rushing — that went to **Markus Wheaton**, who had 66 yards on three carries — but averaged 4.1 yards per rush on 10 carries. **Terron Ward**, who started the game, carried the ball 13 times for 43 yards, including a season-long 29-yard rush in the first quarter.

Mannion became just the fifth Oregon State quarterback to throw for more than 3,000 yards in a single-season, joining Derek Anderson (three times), Sean Canfield, Jonathan Smith and Matt Moore. He tossed for 339 yards against Washington, and has the program's sixth-best single-season mark with 3,033.

Mannion found Rodgers on a 6-yard pass with 7:30 left in the first quarter to tie the game at seven after Washington's Austin Seferian-Jenkins had scored on a 4-yard pass less than four minutes into the game.

The tie game didn't last long, however, as Mannion threw another 6-yard touchdown pass with 2:52 remaining in the first quarter. **Micah Hatfield** was the recipient of the throw, who not only caught his first career touchdown, but his first career pass.

Trevor Romaine connected on a 24-yard field goal as time expired in the first half, giving the Beavers a 17-14 lead entering halftime. Seferian-Jenkins caught his second score of the game earlier, and Romaine's 15th field goal of the season gave the Beavers the lead for good.

Washington accumulated 158 yards of total offense in the first half and the OSU defense remained stout in the second half, allowing the Huskies 157 in the final two quarters for a final total of 315.

EUGENE, Ore. — Oregon State quarterback **Sean Mannion** passed for 299 yards and three touchdowns but it wasn't enough to overcome No. 10 Oregon in a 49-21 loss to the Ducks at Autzen Stadium.

The game marked the 115th contest between the teams in the Civil War, presented by the Northwest Ford Dealers and PacificSource Health Plans. It is the longest running rivalry west of the Rocky Mountains.

Oregon ran 102 plays and gained 615 yards, jumping out to a 28-7 halftime lead and eventually pushing its advantage to 42-7. Mannion threw touchdown passes to **Kevin Cummings** — the first of his career — and **Brandin Cooks** to pull the Beavers closer in the fourth quarter.

Mannion ended the game completing 27-of-44 passes and his 299 yards passing gave him 3,328 on the season, the third-best single-season mark in team history.

The Beavers held on early, tying the game at seven when Mannion found a wide open **Jovan Stevenson** in the flat for a 58-yard touchdown pass. It was the third-longest scoring play of the season for the Beavers, and it came at the 11:08 mark of the second quarter.

The Ducks, however, scored the next 35 points to take control of the game.

Cummings led the Beavers (3-9 overall, 3-6 Pac-12) with 63 yards receiving, and he set up his 19-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter with a 26-yard catch that set a career-long for distance.

Stevenson (58 yards) and Cooks (56) were close behind Cummings in terms of yardage.

Markus Wheaton had two catches for 39 yards, giving him 986 on the season, the 10th-best single-season mark in team history.

Darron Thomas was 27-of-40 for 305 yards for Oregon (10-2, 8-1), throwing for four touchdowns. He found four different receivers in the end zone: David Paulson, DeAnthony Thomas, Colt Lyerla and Kenjon Barner.

LaMichael James was Oregon's leading rusher with 142 yards on 24 carries. He found the end zone on a 1-yard run less than four minutes into the game.

Defensively, the Beavers were led by both **Scott Crichton** and **Feti 'Unga**, who had 12 and 13 tackles, respectively. For Crichton, it set a career-high, surpassing the 11 he had against UCLA earlier in the season.
