2012: Rueben is the most experienced linebacker on the roster and has started at all three linebacker spots ... will be a frontrunner for the vacant "Sam" linebacker position ... also has been a solid special teams player ... good cover backer. 2011: Although Rueben was considered a returning starter at middle linebacker, he moved to outside linebacker in fall camp ... played in 10 games, starting four ... started at least one game at all three linebacker positions ... forced back to middle linebacker against BYU due to injuries to Feti 'Unga and Tony Wilson ... established a career-high with nine tackles in a start at middle linebacker against Stanford ... also recorded seven tackles at Utah ... missed the last two games of the season due to a concussion. 2010: Started seven games ... registered 35 tackles, posting a season-high of six tackles at UCLA ... played in all 12 games. 2009: One of eight true freshmen to play ... was the primary back-up at middle linebacker ... had roles on several special teams ... set season-high six tackles at Oregon, including 1.5 TFLs.



Centennial High School special teams player of the year three times ... set state record for PATs converted with 217 and for kicking points with 280 ... set school record by converting a 52-yard field goal ... helped Centennial to state title as a junior ... reached the state championship game as a sophomore ... scored 105 total points as a sophomore to lead the nation according to MaxPreps ... *Press Enterprise* all-area team punter in 2009.
