2008-09 OSU Season In Review

The Season

Oregon State finished the 2008-09 season with a 20-12 overall record. The Beavers were 9-9 in Pacific-10 Conference games, finishing in a tie for fourth place.

Oregon State was 13-3 in home games, 6-6 in games played on the road and 1-3 in neutral site contests.

20 Wins

Oregon State finished the 2008-09 season with a 20-12, the team's most victories since the 1994-95 season.

In The WNIT

Oregon State made its second trip to the WNIT under head coach LaVonda Wagner and the sixth since the 2001 season. The Beavers have now appeared in some version of the WNIT eight times.

The Beavers opened the WNIT with a 59-47 victory over Portland State at legendary Gill Coliseum. Advancing to the third round, they lost to New Mexico, 61-56, in Rio Rancho.

All-time, Oregon State is 12-6 (.667) in the WNIT, winning it in 1980 and 1982. Carol Menken holds the school record for points in a WNIT game with 33 against Drake in 1980.

All-Pac-10

Prior to the Pac-10 Tournament, Brittney Davis was named to the All-Pac-10 Third Team while Talisa Rhea and Mercedes Fox-Griffin were named honorable mention.

Fox-Griffin was also named to the All-Defensive Team and Davis earned All-Defensive Honorable Mention.

Rhea All-Academic

Talisa Rhea was named to the Pac-10's All-Academic First Team, earning her second academic honor of the year. She was also named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Region Second Team earlier this year.

Mercedes Fox-Griffin was named to the Pac-10's Academic Honorable Mention squad as well.

Wow, They Were Wrong

The Beavers proved the Pac-10 wrong this season. Entering the year, OSU was selected to finish eighth by both the league's coaches and media. The result? Oregon State finished in a three-way tie for fourth.

That's the highest finish for the Beavers since they went 11-7 in league play in 1995-96 and finished second only to Stanford.

Getting Some Pac-10 Wins

The Beavers went 9-9 in Pac-10 games in 2008-09, their most wins in league since the 2001-02 season.

Non-Conference Success

Oregon State won 11 non-conference games, which is the most for a Beavers' team since the club joined the Pac-10 more than 20 years ago.

Getting Warm In December

Oregon State went 6-0 in the month of December, the first time the team ever accomplished that. It also marked the longest win streak for Oregon State since the 2000-01 season.

A Little Bit On Mercedes

Mercedes Fox-Griffin finished her Oregon State career with 491 assists, placing her third in school history.

Fox-Griffin became just the third player in Oregon State history to lead the team in assists in three straight seasons. In each of the last three campaigns, she totaled at least 131 assists.

A Note On BD

Brittney Davis scored in double figures in the last 17 games straight. Of the Beavers' 32 games in 2008-09, she reached at least 10 points in 24.

Talisa And The Art Of The 3

Talisa Rhea set the Pacific-10 Conference single-game record for three-pointers with 10 in the season opener against Sacramento State. She finished the game with 42 points, which is

tied for fifth-most in school history.

Rhea also had 64 three-pointers in 2008-09, the third-most in a single season. After just two seasons, she has made 131 three-pointers, which is second-most by an Oregon State player.

A Few Pac-10 Honors

Both Rhea and Alex Mitchell were named Pac-10 Players of the Week this season. Davis was named All-Pac-10 Third Team and Defensive Honorable Mention. Fox-Griffin and Rhea were named All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention and the former earned All-Defensive honors.

Using Home Court Advantage

Oregon State equaled the school record for most victories at home in a season with 13. The Beavers went 13-3 at home, with their only losses coming to NCAA Tournament bound teams.

The Good Old Charity Stripe

As a team, the Beavers shot .744 from the free-throw line, a school record. That surpassed the previous best, set in 2004-05, of .734.

Head Coach LaVonda Wagner

Head coach LaVonda Wagner completed her fourth season at the helm of Oregon State, and guided the Beavers to their first 20-win season since 1994-95. Oregon State went to the WNIT for the second time in her tenure and she improved her all-time record to 57-65.

Wagner's Assistants

By LaVonda Wagner's side in 2008-09 were three assistant coaches who have a wealth of experience at the collegiate level.

Krista Reinking completed her fourth season as Oregon State and has been an assistant during Wagner's entire tenure in Corvallis. Prior to coming to Oregon State, Reinking was an administrative associate at Texas. She lettered four seasons at Illinois during which Wagner served as an assistant coach.

Kellee Barney completed her first season as an assistant coach at Oregon State. She previously served as an assistant at Arizona before coming to the Beavers. Barney served as head coach at Gonzaga from 1994-2000 after stints as an assistant and associate head coach at Washington State. She has also been an assistant coach at Portland State.

Anthony Turner also finished his first season as an assistant coach at Oregon State. Turner comes to the Beavers from UNLV where he was an assistant coach from 2003-08. He came to the UNLV program from San Diego State, where he was an assistant coach from 2000-02.

Erin Entwistle returned for her fourth year as Director of Basketball Operations while Stacey Clinesmith was in her first as the assistant director. Clinesmith is a former WNBA player who was a four-year letterwinner at UC-Santa Barbara.

- Tayler Champion (Inglewood High - Inglewood, Calif.) - A guard/forward who averaged 16 points and 9.3 rebounds per game last season. She was named Southern California Interscholastic Basketball Coaches Association First-Team in Division 2-A.

- Kate Lanz (Central Catholic High - Portland, Ore.) - a guard from Portland who was named the 2007-08 Gatorade Player of the Year in the state of Oregon. Also was named the Mt. Hood Conference Player of the Year.

- Angela Misa (JSerra Catholic High - San Juan Capistrano, Calif.) - A forward who was recognized by *USA Today* for her 23-rebound performance against a rival high school. She averaged 15 points and 12.7 rebounds per game a year ago.

- Haiden Palmer (Vista del Lago High - Moreno Valley, Calif.) - She was named to the Southern California Interscholastic Basketball Coaches Association Division 1-A Second Team. Palmer averaged 17.5 points per game as a junior and tallied 97 assists.

Legendary Gill

Gill Coliseum has been the home to Oregon State women's basketball since the program's inception in the 1978-79 season. The Beavers have gone 252-139 (.638) in games played at legendary Gill.

The coliseum seats 10,400.

Pac-10 Tournament

The 2008-09 Pacific-10 Conference Tournament was held from March 12-15 in Los Angeles at the Galen Center, home to USC men's and women's basketball.

Oregon State went 0-1 at the tournament, and Stanford won it.

FSN Northwest

FSN Northwest aired the popular 30-minute "Beavers All-Access" show with it beginning in January on Wednesday afternoons. Head coach LaVonda Wagner was a regular on the show.

Beavers On The Radio

Every Oregon State women's basketball game in 2008-09 aired on the radio, either on the AM dial or online at osubeavers.com. Fans caught the games on KLOO 1340-AM or KTHH 990-AM in the Corvallis area. Every game was also available at Beaver Nation Online (osubeavers.com).

For the second straight season, 10 select games were also available to fans in the Portland area on KKAD 1550-AM.

Back for his third full season as the primary voice of Oregon State women's basketball was Todd Mansfield. Ron Callan of KPAM 860 filled in when Mansfield was not available.

Beaver Sports Talk

Most of the Oregon State radio network will carry Beaver Sports Talk, which airs every Tuesday during basketball season beginning at 7 p.m. The show originates from McMenamins on Monroe and will feature Oregon State basketball coaches LaVonda Wagner and Craig Robinson as well as selected players.

Beaver Sports Talk is on Thursday nights through December.

Rhea Sets Pac-10 3-Point Record

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Oregon State sophomore Talisa Rhea set the Pacific-10 Conference record for three-pointers, knocking down 10 in the Beavers' 100-45 victory over Sacramento State at legendary Gill Coliseum. The game marked the regular season opener for the Oregon State women's basketball team.

Rhea posted the fourth-most points in school history with 42 points set two Pac-10 records; the 10 three-pointers and 19 three-pointers attempted. The last player to set the Pac-10 three-pointer record was Stanford's Molly Goodenbour in 1992 against Tennessee.

"All of the credit goes to my teammates for getting me open, giving me the ball and I was just in the right place and was able to hit a couple shots," Rhea said. "We were just running our offense, trying to execute, working on the little things we have been working on in practice and there is still room for improvement. We still have to fix up a few things, but my teammates did a good job of giving me the ball."

The Pac-10 record setting three-pointer gave the Beavers their 100th point of the game,

which is the first time they have scored 100 since a 100-86 victory over Washington in 2003.

"I am very happy with the way we executed our game plan tonight," Oregon State head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "We knew that they would come in here looking to shoot deep threes. We also knew that they pretty much started and played five guards. And so our defensive mentality had to be one where we stuck together and really helped each other. This is a transition basketball team we played tonight and the big thing was that we wanted to rebound so we would take away their run and we also wanted to have runs of our own."

At the half Rhea had already set a new personal best in points scored with 25 and had made seven three-pointers. She added 17 points in the second half to finish with 42, 18 points more than her previous high of 24 set last season.

In that 24-point effort last season, Rhea had previously set the Oregon State single-game record with eight three-pointers.

OSU Gets Past Houston By 22

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Sophomores Talisa Rhea and Alex Mitchell led the way offensively for the Oregon State women's basketball Wednesday night as the Beavers improved to 2-0 this season with a 69-47 victory over Houston at legendary Gill Coliseum.

Rhea led all scorers with 18 points on 5-of-13 shooting from the floor, including four three-pointers. She added six rebounds and four assists and stole the ball twice. The Pacific-10 Conference Player of the Week was also 4-for-4 from the free throw line while seeing 36 minutes on the floor.

Mitchell added a career-best 16 points in coming off the bench. She was 6-for-9 from the floor and was a perfect 4-for-4 from the free-throw line. Mitchell added seven rebounds -- three on the offensive boards.

Oregon State dominated the boards, posting 45 to the Cougars' 30. Offensively, the Beavers also had 15 assists, led by Mercedes Fox-Griffin, who had a season-high seven. Houston shot just .333 from the field compared to OSU's .421 clip.

"I would really like to congratulate my team on an excellent first half of basketball," head coach

LaVonda Wagner said. "To open up the game we played really well. We executed our offense, we were able to get some second-chance looks at the basket and we rebounded the basketball. And we got some key stops. Alex came in and gave us a spark off the bench and did a really nice job and gave us a post presence on both ends, both offensively and defensively."

Tiffany Ducker had game high 13 rebounds, 12 of which came on the defensive end. She added seven points, stole the ball four times and recorded one block.

The Beavers opened up a 28-point lead at halftime thanks to a 29-4 run in which they held Houston scoreless for nearly seven minutes. Oregon State shot 50 percent from the floor while the Cougars were at 24 percent. The Beavers also managed four three-pointers in the half -- all from Rhea, who now has a Pac-10 leading 14 on the season -- while Houston was held to zero.

Beavers Open Junkanoo Jam With Win

FREEPORT, Grand Bahamas – Brittney Davis finished with 16 points, Tiffany Ducker scored a season-high 14 points and the Oregon State women's basketball team held off a strong second-half surge from Arkansas for a 69-56 victory over the Razorbacks in the Beavers' first game of the Junkanoo Jam at St. Georges High School.

Davis finished with 14 second-half points after posting just two in the first half. She finished the game 4-for-12 from the field and 6-of-8 from the free throw line, connecting four straight with less than six minutes remaining in the second half.

Ducker, meanwhile, scored all 14 points in the first half for the Beavers, who improved to 3-0. It marks Oregon State's best start to a season since going 3-0 in 2005-06, head coach LaVonda Wagner's first year with the Beavers.

Arkansas (4-1 overall) posted just 18 first-half points, but scored 38 in the second half and got to within nine, 49-40, at the 9:42 mark of the second half. But the Beavers, who never trailed, outscored the Razorbacks, 20-16, the rest of the way for the 13-point victory.

The Beavers snapped Arkan-

sas' 27-game non-conference win streak that dated back to 2005 when the Razorbacks fell to North Carolina. The Tar Heels, ironically, are Oregon State's opponent on Saturday night. The No. 2 Tar Heels dominated Pacific. 98-62, in the last game of Friday's action.

Led by Davis and Ducker, four Beavers ended the game in double-figures, with Alex Mitchell and Mercedes Fox-Griffin finishing with 12 apiece. Mitchell added seven rebounds for Oregon State, while Fox-Griffin had a team-leading five assists. Kirsten Tilleman, in her third career game, also had seven rebounds for Oregon State.

Overall, Oregon State shot 50 percent from the field while holding the Razorbacks to a 34.8 percent clip. The Beavers held a large advantage on the boards, 46-28, including a 33-16 mark on the defensive end.

Oregon State took a 44-18 lead into halftime, thanks in large part to 14 points by Ducker. The senior set a season-high in the first half alone, topping her 11 against Sacramento State to open the season.

Oregon State Nearly Upsets No. 2 UNC

FREEPORT, Grand Bahamas – The Oregon State women's basketball team took No. 2 North Carolina to the brink of an upset Saturday, losing a narrow contest to the Tar Heels, 82-78, in the final game of the Junkanoo Jam at St. Georges High School.

"I'm very proud of the way our team played tonight," Oregon State head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "We played as a team, we played with confidence and we fought hard. We were behind on rebounding and that was key in this game, but we should be very proud with our effort tonight. We played well and had a very good North Carolina team on the ropes."

The Beavers (3-1 overall) got to within two, 80-78, with six seconds remaining on a jumper by Brittany Kennedy. But two late free throws by North Carolina (8-0) enabled the Tar Heels to win by four.

Brittney Davis led Oregon State with 22 points and finished with 38 over the two games in the Bahamas to earn All-Tournament team honors. Of her 22 points in the game against North Carolina, 10 came in the second half as the Beavers erased a deficit that stood as much as 18. Davis added six assists and a steal in 35 minutes.

Talisa Rhea came in closely be-

hind Davis, posting 18 points – 15 in the second half – to go along with four assists. Mercedes Fox-Griffin also had a big game for the Beavers, finishing with 14 points.

The Beavers shot an impressive 62 percent from the field in the second half to push the Tar Heels to the near upset. The Beavers finished with 48 points in the half after putting down 30 in the first half.

North Carolina held a 65-55 lead at the 10:42 mark of the second half but saw the Beavers fight their way to within five, 75-70, with 3:43 left. Oregon State held North Carolina scoreless from the 6:25 mark until 1:47 remained in the half. During that stretch, the Beavers scored eight points to pull within striking range.

The Tar Heels sank two free throws with 1:48 left to get ahead by four, 76-72. Ten seconds later, the Beavers pulled to within two on a layup by Davis, making the score 77-75.

With 45 seconds remaining, and after a North Carolina free throw, Davis hit a jumper to make it 78-77 in favor of the Tar Heels. But the Tar Heels managed a jumper and two free throws from that point on while the Beavers were held to Kennedy's jumper with six seconds remaining.

Beavers Defeat USF With Balance

SAN FRANCISCO – The Oregon State women's basketball team utilized a balanced approach, shooting well from the field and controlling the boards in a 83-66 win over San Francisco at War Memorial Gymnasium.

The Beavers shot better than 54 percent from the field, just below their season high of 54.4 percent achieved in the season opener against Sacramento State. Oregon State, meanwhile, finished with 45 rebounds to San Francisco's 28, improving to 4-0 this season when out-rebounding its opponent.

All told, four Beavers finished in double figures in scoring, led by Alex Mitchell who had 17 points to go along with eight rebounds. Brittney Davis posted 15 points on 5-of-7 shooting, while Kassandra McCalister had a season-high 12 points. Mercedes Fox-Griffin posted 11 points to go along with a team-leading 11 points.

Rebounding-wise, Oregon State held a 31-15 advantage defensively. Kirsten Tilleman led the Beavers with a season-high nine rebounds, followed by Mitchell's eight. Nine of the 10 Beavers who played Wednesday night had at

least one, with seven finishing with three or more.

The Beavers held San Francisco to 32.8 percent shooting from the field and 30 percent from beyond the three-point line. Shay Rollins led the Dons with 20 points, and was followed closely by Necolia Simmons' 19 and Rheina Ale's 12. Simmons led San Francisco with nine rebounds.

Oregon State, already up by 12 at halftime, had a strong start to the second half, posting 10 points by the 17:50 mark. Of those 10, six came from Tiffany Ducker, who was held scoreless in the first half. The 10 points constituted a 10-4 run.

The Beavers (4-1 overall) continued that trend, taking a 60-43 lead into the media timeout at the 11:33 mark. San Francisco (2-5) managed to get within 10, 69-59, with 3:38 remaining, but the Beavers were able to hold on for the victory after going on a 14-7 run to end the game.

OSU Holds Portland State To 24

CORVALLIS, Ore. – The Oregon State women's basketball tied a school record for fewest points allowed in a game, running away from Portland State with a 58-24 victory Sunday afternoon at legendary Gill Coliseum.

The 24 points allowed by the Beavers tied the school record set in 1989 in a 63-24 win over UC-Irvine. Oregon State (5-1 overall) allowed the Vikings (5-3) to make just nine baskets from the field Sunday, to go along with four free throws. The Vikings made just two three-pointers.

"Portland state is a really good basketball team; they have been shooting the three-pointer really well," Oregon State head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "That was one of our points of emphasis. We had to guard them behind the arch and we did a really nice job of that tonight. We held them to 2-of-14. Also, they run in transition and so we made a commitment to rebound the ball to stop their run. Those were two things I thought we did really well the entire night."

Oregon State managed 36 rebounds to Portland State's 31, and forced 35 Viking turnovers.

The Beavers also posted 16 steals. Portland State's leading scorer, Kelsey Kahle, scored just five points after coming into the game averaging better than 15.

Alex Mitchell led Oregon State with 13 points, and was trailed by Brittney Davis and Tiffany Ducker, who both had 10 in the win. Oregon State shot 43.8 percent from the field and posted 13 assists, led by Mercedes Fox-Griffin's four.

Oregon State came out strong in the first half and went into its locker room with a 29-6 lead. Defense played a big role for the Beavers as they held Portland State to only 14 percent from the floor in the first half. Overall, the Vikings managed to shoot just 22 percent, the lowest total for an Oregon State opponent since the Beavers held Arizona to a 27.3 percent clip in the 2008 Pacific-10 Conference Tournament.

The Vikings were held to four points for more than 19 minutes and were held scoreless for nearly 10 minutes in the first half. Kelli Valentine made a jumper at the 16:51 mark of the half for the Vikings' first points. Portland State did not make another shot until 10:36 remained.

OSU Drops 91 Points On UNLV

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Three players scored in double figures and Mercedes Fox-Griffin nearly had a double-double as the Oregon State women's basketball team defeated UNLV, 91-54, at legendary Gill Coliseum.

Alex Mitchell led the Beavers with 23 points, while Brittney Davis scored 22 and Talisa Rhea had 20 in the victory. Fox-Griffin, meanwhile, posted eight points and nine assists.

Overall, the Beavers shot better than 47 percent from the field, compared to 43.8 percent for UNLV. Oregon State, however, limited the Lady Rebels to just 48 attempts from the field while taking 76 shots.

The Beavers (6-1 overall) matched their best start to a season since LaVonda Wagner's first season as Oregon State's head coach, 2005-06, by turning the ball over just six times. Fox-Griffin's nine assists were just a portion of the team's total: the Beavers had 28, compared to seven for UNLV (4-4).

Mitchell was 10-for-14 from the field and had seven rebounds

in 27 minutes. Davis, meanwhile, was 7-for-12 with six assists and six rebounds. Rhea also had six assists and was 8-for-17 from the field. She also knocked down four three-pointers. Davis had three as well as Oregon State knocked down nine for the game.

Oregon State limited UNLV to zero second-chance points, out-rebounding the Lady Rebels, 49-22, including 24-5 offensively. The Beavers had 17 second-chance points to go along with 27 off 19 UNLV turnovers.

The Beavers jumped out to a 31-point lead with 7:39 remaining left in the second half. Mercedes Fox-Griffin sank a layup on an assist from Brittney Davis. Through the first 12-plus minutes of the half, Oregon State had outscored UNLV, 35-19.

Oregon State took a 44-27 lead into halftime after the Beavers shot better than 44 percent from the floor. UNLV, meanwhile, shot 42.1 percent from the floor but the Beavers managed 34 shots from the field while the Lady Rebels had just 19.

Beavers Drop Irvine In California

IRVINE, Calif. – Brittney Davis and Alex Mitchell had 18 points apiece to pace the Beavers as the Oregon State women's basketball team defeated UC Irvine, 71-42, at the Bren Events Center.

The win pushes Oregon State's win streak to four games, the Beavers' longest since a five-game streak toward the end of the 2000-01 season. During that streak, Oregon State has defeated San Francisco, Portland State, UNLV and UC Irvine, with each win coming by at least 17 points.

The win Thursday night put the Beavers at 7-1 on the year while UC Irvine dropped to 3-6.

For Mitchell, it was her fourth straight game in which she paced the Beavers in scoring. She shared the team lead in scoring with Davis in the Beavers' victory over San Francisco on Dec. 3. Against UC Irvine Thursday night, Mitchell was 8-for-12 from the field and finished with five rebounds.

For Davis, meanwhile, it was her fifth game in double figures this season. The senior guard was 6-for-13 from the floor and had a career-high four three pointers in eight attempts. Davis also had six assists to pace Oregon State.

Mercedes Fox-Griffin posted

12 points in the win to go along with four assists. As a team, the Beavers finished with 18 assists to just five for UC Irvine.

Oregon State forced UC Irvine to turn the ball over 18 times while the Beavers finished with 12 steals. Kirsten Tilleman led Oregon State with three steals in 28 minutes of play.

The Beavers shot 46.3 percent from the floor compared to just 35.7 for UC Irvine. Oregon State improved to 7-0 this season when finishing with a better shooting percentage than its opponent.

Oregon State took a 41-20 lead into the locker room at halftime. The Beavers sank 11 free throws in the half, which saw the teams combine for 25 personal fouls.

Beavers Hold Off Roadrunners

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Talisa Rhea had 23 points and the Oregon State women's basketball team withstood a strong challenge from Cal State Bakersfield to defeat the Roadrunners, 66-56, at legendary Gill Coliseum.

Rhea was 7-for-17 from the field to lead the Beavers, who improved to 8-1 this season, tying their best start to a season since Oregon State's 1998-99 campaign.

Of Rhea's 23 points, 16 came in the second half. She knocked down two three-pointers in the win and went to the free-throw line seven times, making every attempt.

Mercedes Fox-Griffin pitched in with 17 points and a team-leading six assists in 35 minutes. Alex Mitchell also had 12 points in the win, giving her double-digit in five straight contests.

Cal State Bakersfield (7-6 overall) hung with the Beavers for most of the second half, staying within single digits for most of the half. The Beavers, who had a five-point lead at the half, were able to hold on behind Rhea's 16 second-half points. The Beavers went to the line 29 times, with 22 of those coming in the second half.

Overall, the Beavers shot 75.9 percent from the charity stripe

overall, and was 19-for-24 (.792) in the second half.

Oregon State combined for eight blocks, easily a season-high, surpassing the four against Arkansas. Tiffany Ducker had four blocks, while Mitchell and Rhea had two apiece.

For the eighth time in nine games this season, the Beavers took a lead into the break, albeit a smaller one than in the previous seven instances. Oregon State led 28-23 and was led by Mitchell, who posted 10 points in the first half. She was followed closely by Rhea, who had seven points.

The Beavers shot 34.3 percent in the first half compared to 31 percent for Cal State Bakersfield. Mitchell and Ducker combined for four blocks in the first half, which tied the overall team high for a single-game this season.

Katie Williams scored 15 of the Roadrunners' 23 first-half points after shooting 6-of-7 with a three-pointer and two free throws. Williams ended the game with a team-high 32 points overall.

OSU Dispatches Western Oregon

CORVALLIS, Ore. – The Oregon State women's basketball team wrapped up its early season non-conference schedule with a 66-32 victory over Western Oregon at legendary Gill Coliseum.

The win puts Oregon State at 9-1 on the year, the team's best start to a season since the 1995-96 team went 10-1 to open its campaign. The win was also the Beavers' sixth in a row, the longest since the 2000-01 Oregon State team won its first six games of the season.

On Sunday, Talisa Rhea led the Beavers with 15 points and Kirsten Tilleman posted a season-best 12 to pace the Beavers to the 34-point victory. Rhea was 5-for-13 from the floor and 3-for-6 from the three-point line, while Tilleman was a perfect 8-for-8 from the free-throw line.

The Beavers were dominant on the boards, leading the Wolves, 49-31. Tiffany Ducker led the club with 11, including six offensively. Oregon State finished with 23 offensive rebounds.

Western Oregon turned the ball over 24 times, which led to

36 Oregon State points. The Beavers, on the strength of their 49 rebounds, finished with 30 points in the paint to just 16 for the Wolves (5-6 overall).

Another look at the numbers shows that the Beavers finished with 29 points from their bench – paced by Tilleman's 12 and another seven from Brittany Kennedy. Oregon State also had 16 second-chance points to six for Western Oregon.

Katie Torland, who came into the game as Western Oregon's leading scorer with an average of 17.4 points per game, scored nine to lead the Wolves. She was 3-for-9 from the floor as Western Oregon shot 28.9 percent from the field. Oregon State, meanwhile, was 34.9 percent from the floor and a shade better from beyond the arc at 35.3 percent (6-for-17).

OSU Loses Close Contest To UCLA

LOS ANGELES – The Oregon State women's basketball lost a tight decision to UCLA, 60-53, at Pauley Pavilion.

Alex Mitchell paced Oregon State with a career-high 24 points, surpassing her 23 points earlier this season against UNLV. Mitchell was 9-for-12 from the field and hit on six of her seven free-throw attempts.

Brittney Davis also reached double figures for the Beavers. She connected on five shots from the field, including two from beyond the three-point line.

The game marked the Pacific-10 Conference opener for both teams. The Beavers dropped to 9-2 overall on the year, and the loss snapped a six-game win streak, the team's longest since the 2000-01 season.

UCLA, meanwhile, improved to 10-2 on the year.

Oregon State shot 36.5 percent from the field, and grabbed 32 rebounds, with Tiffany Ducker leading the team with 10.

The Beavers also managed 10 steals, with Ducker and Mitchell tying for the team lead with three apiece.

The Bruins, meanwhile, shot slightly better than 43 percent and were led by Nina Earl, who had 15

points. Overall, UCLA finished the game with 35 rebounds.

The Beavers trailed by as much as 13 with 12:16 left in the second half, and on the strength of timely shooting, pulled to within four, 52-48, with 3:53 remaining. But the Bruins, who 9-for-11 from the charity stripe on the night, sank all but one free throw down the stretch for the win.

Oregon State, meanwhile, was 13-for-15 from the free-throw line, a shooting percentage of better than 86 percent. That figure is slightly lower than the season high of .889 achieved in the season opener against Sacramento State.

Oregon State found itself down by one, 25-24, at the half. Mitchell led the Beavers with nine points in the first half on the strength of 4-of-6 shooting. As a team, Oregon State shot 41.7 percent from the field, while UCLA was at 44 percent.

The Beavers shot 42.5 percent from the field, but managed 40 shots compared to 69 for USC. The Women of Troy, meanwhile, shot 44.9 percent from the field. USC was led by Brynn Cameron's 20 points. Oliver had 19.

Brittney Davis had eight points on the strength of five three-throw makes.

Tiffany Ducker had seven rebounds to pace the Beavers, who had 25 boards. USC, meanwhile, posted 39 rebounds, led by seven apiece from Oliver and Nadia Parker.

The Beavers shot 43.8 percent from the field in the first half, but found themselves behind USC, 44-21, entering halftime. Mitchell paced Oregon State with six first-half points on the strength of 3-for-5 shooting from the field.

Oregon State held its opponent to less than 50 points for the sixth time this season and outscored Arizona 29-9 in points off turnovers. It also outscored Arizona 24-16 in points in the paint.

Beavers Lose To No. 11 Stanford

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Both Brittney Davis and Alex Mitchell finished in double figures and the Oregon State women's basketball team came out strong in the first half but could not hang on against No. 11 Stanford, falling to the Cardinal, 69-54, at legendary Gill Coliseum.

"First of all I would like to say I thought my team played really hard for 35 minutes of the game," head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "I thought we did a great job of getting some stops and scoring against a very good basketball team. The two things we talked about before the game were that we could not turn the ball over and we needed to rebound the basketball. If you look at the stat sheet the thing that stands out to me is the number of rebounds that Stanford had."

Mitchell led Oregon State with 14 points while Davis had 10. The Beavers took a one-point lead into halftime but early foul trouble in the second half made it difficult to stay with the Cardinal. Stanford outscored the Beavers, 42-26, in the second half to take the victory.

Mitchell had four rebounds to go along with her 14 points. She was 6-for-11 from the field.

Davis, meanwhile, hit on two

three-pointers to finish with the 10 points. She also had four assists, which was second on the team only to Mercedes Fox-Griffin, who had five. Fox-Griffin totaled nine points herself and had three rebounds in 38 minutes of play.

Stanford (15-4, 6-1) turned it on in the second half, finishing with the 42 points after managing 27 in the first half. Included in those 42 points were 24 in the paint. Stanford was led by Jayne Appel who had a double-double with game highs in points and rebounds with 18 and 12, respectively.

Four other players for the Cardinal scored in double digits including Jillian Harmon and Jeanette Pohlen both with 12, Kayla Pedersen with 11, and Nnemkadi Ogwumike with 10.

The Cardinal shot 61.5 percent from the field in the second half.

Beavers Down Ducks In Civil War

EUGENE, Ore. – Four players scored in double figures as the Oregon State women's basketball team defeated Oregon, 61-42, in the first Civil War game of the 2008-09 season at McArthur Court.

Brittney Davis led Oregon State with 16 points on 5-of-10 shooting. She was joined by Mercedes Fox-Griffin (13 points), Alex Mitchell (12) and Tiffany Ducker (10) in double-figure scoring as the Beavers shot better than 43 percent from the field.

Ducker, in fact, had Oregon State's first double-double of the season, grabbing 10 rebounds to go along with her 10 points.

Oregon, meanwhile, shot 42.9 percent but attempted nine less shots than Oregon State. OSU also connected on three more three-pointers and eight more free throws.

"I feel like we played 40 good minutes against a very good basketball team," Oregon State head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "We played a good game in a good home environment.

Overall, the Beavers dominated offensively, nailing 4-of-9 three-pointers, including two by

Talisa Rhea. The sophomore, who finished with eight points, now has 113 three-pointers for her career, tying her for second for most in school history with Annette Mollerstrom (1992-96).

Oregon State (12-7 overall, 3-6 Pacific-10 Conference) built much of its offense on its rebounding. The Beavers grabbed 38 boards, including 15 offensively, which led to 16 second-chance points. The Ducks, meanwhile, had just 19 rebounds, including five offensively. That gave Oregon (8-12, 4-5) only seven second-chance points.

Oregon State was extremely sharp from the free-throw line, making 13-of-15 (.867) from the stripe. Of Davis' 16 points, five came from the free-throw line. Mitchell also had four free throws in the win.

In addition to her 13 points, Fox-Griffin had six assists. Mitchell had eight rebounds in addition to her 12 points, and Rhea had six boards, including three offensively.

Oregon State led for just about every minute of the game, aside from a few ties gained by Oregon early in the first-half. The Beavers led by as much as 23 at the 5:12 mark of the second half.

3-Pointers, Mitchell Pace Beavers

TUCSON, Ariz. – The Oregon State women's basketball team hit on a combined eight three-pointers, including seven in the first half, and Alex Mitchell finished with her first double-double of the season in a 63-55 victory over Arizona at the McKale Center.

Mitchell grabbed the team's second double-double of the season, posting 15 points and a season-high 12 rebounds, just two off tying her career high of 14 achieved last season against Oregon. Of her 15 points, nine came off free throws in the second half. Overall, she was 9-for-12 from the charity stripe.

Brittney Davis paced the Beavers with five three-pointers – tying a career-high -- while Talisa Rhea connected on three of her own. For Davis, the three-pointers helped give her a team-leading 20 points, her fourth game this season having reached the 20-point plateau. The Portland native now has five straight games with double-figures in scoring.

In the process of getting her three three-pointers and 13 points overall, Rhea moved into second place in Oregon State history. She now has 116 three-pointers in less than two full seasons.

The Beavers shot 45.5 percent from the field compared to a 41.2

figure for the Wildcats. Oregon State (13-7 overall, 4-6 Pacific-10 Conference) posted 30 rebounds to Arizona's (8-13, 1-9) 28. Mitchell easily led the Beavers with her 12, and was followed by Kirsten Tilleman, who had six, including three offensively.

Oregon State took a 31-25 lead into the second half, slowly building up that six-point margin late in the first half. Of the Beavers 31 points in the half, 21 came by the three-pointer. In fact, the last 18 points scored by the Beavers came off three-pointers by either Davis or Rhea.

That stretch started at the 6:34 mark when Davis nailed her first three-pointer of the game. It was followed by another Davis three-pointer, this one coming with 5:36 left. Rhea then broke Davis' streak with one of her own at 4:31.

Two more Davis three-pointers – one at 2:09 and the other at 1:02 – gave the Beavers a 28-25 lead. Rhea finished off the half with her third three-pointer of the game with less than 20 seconds left.

Naturally, Rhea and Davis led the Beavers in scoring in the half. Davis had 12 points on her four three-pointers, while Rhea was second with nine points.

Oregon State Falls In Tempe

TEMPE, Ariz. — Brittney Davis led the Oregon State women's basketball team with 17 points, but the Beavers lost to Arizona State, 65-54, at Wells Fargo Arena.

For Davis, it was her sixth straight games in double figures and has now led the team in scoring in the last three games and five of the last six. During the last six games, Davis is averaging 19.1 points per game.

Davis ended the game shooting 4-for-12 from the field, knocking down the team's only three-pointer. She was also 8-for-10 from the free-throw line.

Mercedes Fox-Griffin and Talisa Rhea also reached double figures for the Beavers. Fox-Griffin posted 12 points after hitting on four shots and four free throws. Rhea, meanwhile, ended the game with 10 points after five buckets.

Oregon State shot 36.5 percent from the field, while Arizona State was a little less than 53 percent. The Beavers had 20 attempts from the charity stripe, hitting on 15 (75 percent).

But the Sun Devils (17-6, 9-2) were able to hold the Beavers to just four points the rest of the way to hold on to the lead and pull out the win.

The loss snapped Oregon State's two-game win streak, coming after victories over Oregon and Arizona. It also snapped the Beavers' three-game win streak away from legendary Gill Coliseum.

Arizona State took a 31-14 lead into halftime. Fox-Griffin posted six points to lead the Beavers in the first half, while Rhea had four. Sybil Dosty led Arizona State with eight points, while Briann January had seven.

Dymond Simon led Arizona State with 19 points, while January had 15.

OSU Sweeps Season Series Over UW

CORVALLIS, Ore. — Brittney Davis led all Oregon State scorers with 20 points as the Beavers swept the season series over Washington with a 77-63 victory over the Huskies at legendary Gill Coliseum.

"I felt like tonight was a huge step for us," head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "We got in some early foul trouble at the point-guard position. Mercedes Fox-Griffin is very used to running our point and keeping us poised under pressure. We had to put her on the bench early in the first half. Brittney Davis took over the point and did a great job of keeping us poised, running our plays, getting us in the right spots, and then switching up our defenses. We were able to go into half with a 10-point lead. So I felt like that was instrumental in our success tonight."

Davis scored 12 of her 20 points from the free-throw line going a perfect 12-for-12 from the charity stripe. She added three assists and two rebounds.

Oregon State (14-8 overall, 5-7 Pacific-10 conference) shot 78.9 percent from the line, going 30-for-

38 for the game. The 30 free throws made were one short of the all-time team record of 31 set New Year's day in 1982 against Hawai'i.

The Beavers had 25 more free throw attempts than the Huskies, who were 8-for-13 from the line.

Four Beavers scored in double digits; Davis (20), Alex Mitchell (19), Talisa Rhea (18), and Mercedes Fox-Griffin had 11 second-half points.

The Beavers out-rebounded the Huskies by nine, with Kristen Tillman leading the team with a career-high 10.

Overall, the Beavers shot 41.5 percent from field, finishing with 53 shot attempts. The Huskies had 59 attempts from the field, and posted a 42.4 clip. But the Beavers' 22 more free-throw makes made the difference.

Washington (5-17, 1-11) suffered its 11th straight loss off the season and was led by Sami Whitcomb who scored a game-high 23 points.

Whitcomb was the only Husky to score in double digits and was 5-of-9 from three-point range.

Oregon State Takes Down WSU

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Tiffany Ducker's career-high 17 rebounds propelled the Oregon State women's basketball team to a 52-42 win over Washington State at legendary Gill Coliseum.

The 17 rebounds added to a 12-point effort for Ducker, giving her the team's third double-double of the season – and her second of the year. The senior has six career double-doubles in her four years with the Beavers.

"Tonight was a game where our team really gutted it out and did what we had to do to get the win," head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "I felt like we had a lot of adversity during the game. That was a really tough basketball game to play; there was really no rhythm and no flow."

"I know we wanted to close this game out and the only way to stop their transition was to get rebounds," Ducker said. She now has five games with 10 or more rebounds this season. The 17 against Washington State surpassed her previous career-high of 16 achieved against Arizona last season.

Oregon State (15-8 overall, 6-7 Pacific-10 conference) guaranteed itself a winning regular season

for the first time since the 2005-06 campaign. The Beavers have six games remaining – five in conference and a non-conference tilt at UC Santa Barbara on Feb. 24.

"One of the biggest things for us is that we had a great pre-season," Wagner said. "Things are going in a great direction. Everything is where it needs to be. We just have to continue to gut things out."

For the second straight game, the Beavers had four players in double figures. Along with Ducker's 12 points, Brittney Davis added 12 points while Mercedes Fox-Griffin and Alex Mitchell both added 10.

Fox-Griffin added seven steals, which tied her career-high that she set two years ago against Oregon. She also was a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line.

For the second straight game Davis was perfect from the free-throw line, going 8-for-8. She has now posted double figures in eight straight games.

Oregon State shot 81 percent from the free throw line, going 17-for-21. The Beavers controlled the glass, grabbing 45 rebounds to the Cougars' 33. Of those 45, 17 came offensively, with Ducker grabbing seven alone.

Beavers Fall At No. 4 Stanford

STANFORD, Calif. – The Oregon State women's basketball team dropped a 72-43 decision to fourth-ranked Stanford at Maples Pavilion.

Brittney Davis led the Beavers with 12 points after connecting on five baskets from the field, including two three-pointers. The senior has now finished in double figures in her last nine games, a streak that started Jan. 17 against Washington.

Talisa Rhea also had 10 points in the loss. Rhea hit on a three-pointer, her team-leading 54th of the season.

The Beavers shot 30.4 percent from the field compared to 53.3 percent for Stanford. The Cardinal grabbed 39 rebounds to Oregon State's 30. Of the 30 rebounds for the Beavers, 16 were offensively, which matched the Cardinal's.

Stanford, did dominate, however, in points in the paint. Led by 15 apiece from Jayne Appel and Nnemkadi Ogwumike, the Cardinal scored 48 points in the paint compared to 12 for the Beavers. Stanford also got 27 points from its bench compared to 13 for OSU.

Oregon State fell to 15-9 overall this season and 6-8 in Pacific-10 Conference play. Stanford, meanwhile, improved to 21-4 overall and 12-1 in league games.

Stanford pulled away late in the first half for a 12-point lead going into the second half with a 35-23 advantage. Oregon State shot 41.7 percent from the field while Stanford was at a 50 percent clip.

Rhea led the Beavers with seven first-half points – the final three coming on a three-pointer – and Davis, Mitchell and Kassandra McCalister all posted four.

Walker ended the game with a team-leading 20 points, while Alexis Gray-Lawson and Devaneï Hampton both had 11.

Beavers Dispatch UC Santa Barbara

SANTA BARBARA, Calif.

– The Oregon State women's basketball team concluded its regular season non-conference slate by defeating UC Santa Barbara, 70-61, at The Thunderdome.

The win gives the Beavers 10 non-conference victories this season. That is the most in a single season for Oregon State since the Beavers began competing in the Pacific-10 Conference in the 1986-87 season. Overall, Oregon State is 16-10 this season and looks to close out strong in league play when it hosts Oregon, USC and UCLA over the next two weeks to end the season.

Three different Beavers scored in double figures to lead the team Tuesday night, led by Talisa Rhea, who sank three three-pointers to finish with 23 points. Rhea sank 10 baskets from the field and had her sixth 20-point game of the season.

Brittney Davis kept her double-figures streak intact at 11 games after getting 19 points on 5-of-14 shooting. Davis hit on two three-pointers – both coming in the first half – and was good on 7-of-8

free-throw attempts.

Alex Mitchell also hit double figures for Oregon State, grabbing 14 points to go along with six rebounds.

Overall, the Beavers shot 45.9 percent from the field compared to 42.9 percent for UCSB. The Beavers attempted 12 more shots from the field, and 13 overall from beyond the three-point line.

Oregon State also set a school record with fewest turnovers with four. The original record of six was set in 2006 against Oregon, and that was equaled in the seventh game of this season against UNLV.

The Beavers also controlled the boards, grabbing 38 rebounds to the Gauchos' 26. Oregon State also attempted 12 free throws – making nine – compared to just four for UC Santa Barbara (17-9 overall).

Oregon State took a 31-26 into halftime after a back and forth first half. The Beavers built up the five-point lead after a 15-3 run to end the half. The run stretched over the last 8:11 of the first half and consisted of just one UCSB basket.

Beavers Sweep Season From Oregon

CORVALLIS, Ore. - The Oregon State women's basketball team held Oregon to only 10 points in the second half as they completed the program first sweep of the Ducks in 16 years with a 70-41 victory in front of a season high home crowd of 3,507. The 29-point margin was the most in the modern-day history of the series that dates back to 1977.

"The first thing I would like to do is to congratulate my team, Beaver head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "I felt like this was an excellent display of team basketball tonight on both ends of the floor."

Senior Brittney Davis led the way for OSU (17-10 overall, 7-9 Pacific-10 conference) with a game-high 21 points. She added four assists and four steals. The Portland native was 9-for-11 from the free throw line and is now 44-for-50 from the stripe in her last seven games.

The Beavers picked up their defense in the second half and limited the Ducks to 4-for-26 from the field and forced eight turnovers.

Oregon State had 36 rebounds in the game, 12 of which came off the offensive glass, leading to 21 second chance points compared

to Oregon's four. The Beavers also forced 20 turnovers in the game that directly led to 22 points.

"When someone did not make a shot, we did a great job at getting the offensive rebound," Wagner said.

Sophomore Talisa Rhea added 18 points for the Beavers shooting 8-for-16 from the field including two three-pointers while Mercedes Fox-Griffin added 11 points and was 5-for-6 from the free throw line.

Oregon State shot 51 percent from the floor which is the highest shooting percentage in a Pac-10 game this season, while Oregon (9-18, 5-11) struggled shooting 34 percent. Taylor Lilley, who was plagued by foul problems, and Amanda Johnson both had eight points to pace the Ducks.

The Ducks cut the lead to three points with 14:24 left in the second half but then went cold from the floor as the Beavers went on a 19-1 run over nearly 11 minutes.

"Our fans did a great job," Wagner said. "They showed up for us tonight, this was the largest crowd we have had in here to date, and we wanted to make sure they saw a great product and a great game."

Beavers Take Down USC

CORVALLIS, Ore. - Guard Talisa Rhea poured in 18 points, including six free throws in the last 21 seconds, and center Alex Mitchell recorded her second double-double as the Oregon State women's basketball team (18-10, 8-9) edged the USC Trojans 61-58 to move into a tie for fifth-place in the Pac-10 Conference standings.

The Beavers erased a two-point halftime deficit to build a nine-point advantage at 48-39 with 8:23 remaining, but the Trojans battled back to tie the game at 50-50 with 2:57 remaining with an 11-2 run. Rhea then made the critical free throws to hold off a furious USC rally.

"It was just focus," Rhea said of her late-game free throw shooting. "We shoot free throws every day in practice in pressure situations. We come out on our own and shoot extra free throws. It's just about getting into your routine and getting comfortable, and having the confidence to know it's going in."

The Beavers appeared to have the game in hand with a five-point advantage at 57-52 after a pair of free throws at the 21 second mark. However, USC's Camille LeNoir hit a deep three-point field goal with 16 seconds to narrow the gap to 57-55 and after two more Rhea

free throws Ashley Corral hit an improbable trey to close the gap to 59-58. Rhea built the lead back to 61-58, before Le Noir's desperation half court shot sailed right of the hoop at the buzzer.

"They hit some tough shots at the end and we were able to get our press-breakers set and come right back at them," Rhea said. "Luckily as a team we held our composure, we didn't panic. We just got the ball down and shot free throws."

The victory was a benchmark win for the Beavers who now have posted the most victories in a single season for the program since 1996.

"We beat a very good Pac-10 team," OSU head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "This was a very important 40 minutes of basketball for us to play because they are ahead of us in the standings. Going down the home stretch, we want to protect our home court. I felt like Alex gave a tremendous effort with her double, double. Talisa shot the ball very well and our defense down the stretch was tremendous."

Beavers Hold Off UCLA

CORVALLIS, Ore. - The Oregon State women's basketball team added to an already strong resume for postseason play with its fourth consecutive victory, a 61-58 decision over the UCLA Bruins at legendary Gill Coliseum. The Pac-10 Conference game marked the final regular season contest for Beaver seniors Brittney Davis, Mercedes Fox-Griffin and Tiffany Ducker.

"The first thing I would like to do is congratulate my team," Beaver head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "That was an outstanding team win. It is a tremendous close to the regular season; tremendous close to the careers at Gill Coliseum for our seniors. I would also like to thank the community for coming out and cheering for us. It made a big difference having all those people in the stands (att. 2,648) and being our sixth man."

The victory improved OSU to 19-10 overall, its most victories since the 2002 season, and pushed it into a three-way tie for fourth place in the conference with the Bruins (18-11) and USC at 9-9. The nine conference victories represent the most since 11 in 2002, when the team also tied for fourth.

"Finally we are all connecting and we have all bought into

Coach's vision," Fox-Griffin said. "We all have one goal and that's what we have been trying for all year and it has shown."

Davis, who transferred from Minnesota following the 2006 season, scored the first 10 points for the Beavers and her layin at the 16:13 mark of the first half gave OSU a 7-6 lead, a lead it wouldn't surrender the rest of the game. She led four Beavers in double figures for scoring, finishing with a team-high 14 points - all in the opening half.

"I think we have a lot more weapons now, and anyone can score any given night," Davis said. "Before, we just relied on one scorer and now we have an inside game and an outside game, and it's a great feeling to be 19-10."

The Beavers built an 11-point lead on eight occasions, the first at 33-22 late in the first half, before they settled on a 36-27 advantage at the break. OSU then held no less than an eight-point lead throughout nearly the entire second half, before a late UCLA rally inside the four minute mark. Neither team scored in the last 1:29 of the foul-plagued game in which there were 50 fouls leading to four disqualifications. UCLA had two chances to the tie the game in the final 29 seconds.

LOS ANGELES - The UCLA Bruins erased a five-point halftime deficit to defeat Oregon State 62-56 in the quarterfinals of the State Farm Pac-10 Conference Women's Basketball Tournament at the Galen Center Friday. The victory pushed UCLA into the semifinals against No. 2 Stanford Saturday night, while Oregon State awaits a possible postseason berth after finishing with a 19-11 record.

The Beavers built the first half lead of 26-21 behind the play of senior guard Brittney Davis. Davis had 15 points at the break; she would end with a game-high 22 points, including 12 of the team's first 14 points. The lead was tempered though as OSU was in serious foul trouble already at halftime, a fact that proved to be the difference at the end.

The lead bounced back and forth for the next six minutes before Atonye Nyingifa put the Bruins in the lead for good at 50-49 with a jump

shot.

The Beavers were severely hampered by foul problems at the end of the game as center Tiffany Ducker was disqualified and forward Kirsten Tilleman and Fox-Griffin had four fouls. Tilleman started the game, but played only 21 minutes due to fouls. UCLA used free throw opportunities to ice the game at the end.

CORVALLIS, Ore. - Senior Brittney Davis had a team-high 17 points as the Oregon State Beavers advanced to the third round of the Women's National Invitational Tournament with a 59-47 win over Portland State at legendary Gill Coliseum.

"First of all I would like to congratulate my team on a 20-win season, that hasn't happened since the 1994-95 season," OSU head coach LaVonda Wagner said. "I thought it was an excellent basketball game, both teams competed hard for 40 minutes. They (PSU) did a nice job of rebounding the basketball but we did force them into 25 turnovers. Also, we were able to get to the free throw line and were able to make our free throws and so we're really happy about that."

Senior guard Mercedes Fox-Griffin was one of three Beavers to score in double digits with 12 points. She led the team with five assists and was a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line.

"I'm really happy with how we've been playing and how far we've come" Fox-Griffin said. "We went to the post-season my freshman year, but it feels really good to get our first win and continue to

play."

Davis was 6-for-17 shooting from the field before fouling out of the game with 1:25 left in the second half. She also had one of the team's three 3-pointers and was 4-of-5 from the free throw line.

"The second half I just tried to relax and take my time on my shot," Davis said. "I think I rushed it a lot in the first half (0-7). I was more patient in the second half and was able to get the shots that I did."

Senior Tiffany Ducker came into the game leading the Beavers with 6.9 rebounds per game and added to that recording a game-high 11 in the game, five of which came off the offensive glass. She also added six points.

Talisa Rhea added 10 points in the game, six of which came off of two 3-pointers. She had four rebounds and two assists in 35 minutes.

Clair Foucher led the Vikings (23-10) with a game high 19 points, but could find little help from her teammates. No other Viking scored in double digits while Kelsey Kahle and Kelli Valentine both had eight points. Both Foucher and Kahle fouled out in the second half.

2008-09 Season Ends In New Mexico

RIO RANCHO, N.M. -

Brittney Davis scored a team-leading 19 points, but the Oregon State women's basketball team saw its season come to an end with a 61-56 loss at New Mexico.

The Beavers end their 2008-09 campaign with a 20-12 overall record, reaching the third round of the WNIT after defeating Portland State last week.

Davis scored her last collegiate three-pointer with 7.2 seconds remaining to pull the Beavers to within three, 59-56. The shot, a running jumper from way beyond the three-point line, came just seconds after New Mexico nailed two free throws.

The Lobos, after an Oregon State foul, sealed the game with two free throws from Amy Beggin with five seconds left. The win pushed New Mexico to 25-10 this season and advanced the Lobos to a quarterfinal game Monday at home against Kansas.

The three-pointer was the third of the night for Davis, with each coming in the second half and each pulling the Beavers to within five of the Lobos. She hit one at 3:24 and 1:41 before the final one of her career. The game Friday night was also the final one for fellow seniors

Tiffany Ducker and Mercedes Fox-Griffin.

Ducker was second on the team with 11 points while she grabbed seven rebounds for the Beavers, who finished with a 35-33 advantage on the boards. Kirsten Tilleman led Oregon State with 11 boards.

Fox-Griffin finished with eight points and four rebounds.

Oregon State shot 37.7 percent from the field and hit on three three-pointers, all coming from Davis. New Mexico posted a 40.4 percent clip.

The teams seesawed in the first half to come to a 29-29 tie at the break. Oregon State shot 42.9 percent in the first half, while New Mexico managed to shoot 41.7 from the floor. Rebounds were close, with the Beavers holding an 18-14 advantage.
