



2009-10 Outlook: Despite being a junior is already regarded as one of the top three-point shooters in school history and has an opportunity to become a name in the Pac-10 ... Has evolved into a three-point shooter after taking most of her shots inside the three-point line in high school ... Will be relied upon to be a leader as a junior as she has significant Pac-10 experience ... Worked in the offseason to have more of an all-around game and score in a variety of ways.

2008-09: Played in and started all 32 games ... Led Oregon State with 64 three-pointers, which is third most in school history ... Finished second on the team with 13.5 points per game (eighth in the Pac-10) and averaged 3.8 rebounds ... Played in all 18 Pac-10 games ... In league games, averaged 12.6 points and 3.7 rebounds ... Totaled 31 three-pointers against Pac-10 foes ... Set a Pac-10 record with 10 three-pointers against Sacramento State, finishing with a career-best 42 points (11/16) ... The effort earned her Pac-10 Player of the Week honors for the second time in her career ... Led Oregon State with 18 points to go along with six rebounds in 36 minutes against Houston (11/19) ... Finished with 18 points -- 15 in the second half -- in OSU's near upset of North Carolina (11/29) ... Totaled 20 points on the strength of four three-pointers against UNLV (12/15) ... 


