MEET #13

Three Oregon State gymnasts - **Brittany Harris**, **Makayla Stambaugh** and **Chelsea Tang** - qualified as individuals to compete at the 2013 NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships presented by Northwestern Mutual. Harris and Tang will perform in the all-around and Stambaugh will compete on the floor exercise ... All three OSU gymnasts will perform in the evening session of semifinals beginning at 6 p.m., Friday, April 19 at Pauley Pavilion ... The Beavers will perform as individuals seeking a shot at individual national titles. The top four individuals in each event (plus ties) from Friday's semifinals will compete in the individual event finals competition on Sunday, April 22 at 1 p.m.

FOLLOWING THE ACTION

The NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships will not be televised. Fans unable to attend the meet can view the competition via the Internet with Friday's semifinal sessions streaming at www.ncaa.com. Saturday's Super Six and Sunday's Individual Event Finals will stream live via ESPN3.com, which is ESPN's live multi-screen network, a 24/7 destination that delivers thousands of global sports events annually and accessible online via WatchESPN.com. The talent will be Kathy Johnson-Clarke (play-by-play) with Bart Conner providing analysis ... Live stats will available through www.ncaa.com ... Oregon State fans are also encouraged to follow the action via the OSU Gymnastics Twitter feed - @OregonStateGym.

OSU HISTORY AT NATIONALS

Oregon State has qualified as a team to the NCAA Championships 23 times and has 26 national championship appearances (including AIAW) ... This marks the fourth time in school history that OSU has had individuals qualify to nationals; Tanya Riccioli-Hebron is the most recent OSU gymnast to qualify as an individual making an all-around appearance in 2004. In addition, Lara Degenhardt (floor) and Megan Murphy-Barcroft (vault & floor) went to the NCAA Championships as individuals in 1999. Deanne Droege Mueller (bars) and Megan Murphy (all-around) also earned individual tickets in 1998.

ROTATION ORDER

All three of Oregon State individual qualifiers will perform in semifinal session II beginning at 6 p.m. PT. **Brittany Harris** will rotate with Arkansas beginning on the vault, **Chelsea Tang** will be attached to Michigan and will begin on the uneven bars, and **Makayla Stambaugh** will perform on the floor exercise with UCLA during the third rotation. LAST TIME ON THE COMPETITION FLOOR

The Beavers' season, as a team, came to a premature end at the NCAA Corvallis Regional April 6. Beginning the meet on the uneven bars, where OSU was ranked fifth in the nation, the Beavers suffered through a rotation that included three falls. OSU rebounded to tie its season-high (49.275) on the beam in the next rotation but damage was done. OSU finished the meet fourth in the field of six and missed qualifying to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2005. **Makayla Stambaugh** scored 9.950 on the floor exercise to tie for the regional title and qualified to nationals on the event. In addition, **Chelsea Tang** finished third in the all-around (39.300) and **Brittany Harris** was fifth in the all-around (39.125) and both advanced to nationals as well.

LAST YEAR AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Oregon State stumbled on its first event, the floor exercise, but continued to fight on to the end registering the team's best score of the meet on the final event, balance beam, but it wasn't enough. The Beavers finished sixth in the evening session and 12th overall, but just .150 points separated 8th from 12th. Three gymnasts - **Melanie Jones**, **Leslie Mak** and **Makayla Stambaugh** - earned All-American accolades, and despite the struggles of the front half of the floor lineup, all three earned their honors on the floor apparatus. Jones scored 9.875 on the floor to advance to the Individual Event Finals where she eventually finished fourth in the nation. Mak added a 9.90 on the beam to finish the meet to earn second team All-America honors. All four of the Beavers' all-arounders surpassed the 39-point mark with Stambaugh (39.350) leading the way followed by **Brittany Harris** (39.325), Jones (39.275) and Mak (39.075).

RETURNING ALL-AMERICANS

OSU returns two gymnasts who have combined for five All-America honors in their careers. Senior **Makayla Stambaugh** is now a four-time All-American, twice earning first team honors on the floor exercise (finishing 8th in 2011) and once on the uneven bars, where she tied for third in 2011. Stambaugh earned second team All-America on the floor in 2012. Fellow senior **Melanie Jones** earned a the first All-America honors of her career in 2012, finishing fourth on the floor exercise - the best finish for an OSU gymnast on the apparatus since Amy Durham won the event in 1993.

IN THE RANKINGS

All four of the Beavers' lineups ranked among the top 20 in the nation. OSU's bars team finished the season ranked No. 5 (49.350 RQS), the vault team ranked No. 10 (49.350) as was the beam team (49.170) and the floor exercise lineup tied for No. 19 (49.190). **Makayla Stambaugh** was No. 5 in the nation on bars (9.930), tied for No. 13 on the floor (9.915) and No. 13 in the all-around (39.490). **Kelsi Blalock** tied for No. 6 on vault (9.930) and **Melanie Jones** tied for No. 20 on floor (9.905).

PAC-12 CHAMPIONS

Oregon State performed the Beavers set a school-record scoring 197.850 coming from behind in the final rotation to win the Pac-12 Championships in Corvallis. In that final rotation, the Beavers nailed six straight routines on the uneven bars establishing a school-record 49.675 on the apparatus. OSU twice overcame mid-lineup falls (on beam and vault) to recover and set or tied season-highs on all four events. **Makayla Stambaugh** scored 9.975 on bars to win the Pac-12 title and **Melanie Jones** scored 9.95 on the floor to tie for the conference title. In all OSU posted 11 scores of 9.90 or better en route to the Beavers' second conference championship in three years. It is the second time in three years that OSU has won the conference title, also winning the 2011 Pac-10 Championships.

BEAVERS GARNER PAC-12 WEEKLY HONORS

In all Oregon State gymnasts have gained conference attention for their accomplishments on the competition floor five times in 2013. Senior all-arounder **Makayla Stambaugh** claimed four of those awards as Gymnast of the Week over the course of the final month of the regular season (see note on page 3 for more information). But it was senior transfer **Hailey Gaspar** to get things started making her mark on the Pac-12 Conference in just her second meet at Oregon State. Following her week 2 performance Gaspar was named the Pac-12 Freshman/Newcomer of the Week for Jan. 7-13 after scoring 9.875 to tie for the event title in Oregon State's victory over Ohio State.

ALL-PAC-12 TEAM

Eight Oregon State gymnasts combined to earn 11 All-Pac-12 honors when awards were announced recently. OSU's all-conference selections are: **Erika Aufiero** (bars - 2nd team), **Kelsi Blalock** (vault - 1st team), **Hailey Gaspar** (vault - 2nd team), **Brittany Harris** (bars - 1st team), **Melanie Jones** (beam & floor - 1st team) and **Chelsea Tang** (beam - 1st team) ... Stambaugh, a senior, has been a first team selection all four years (FX - '09; UB & FX - '10; AA - '11) ... Blalock, a senior, is a three-time all-conference selection (1st team vault in '11 and 2nd team vault in '12) ... Jones, a senior, was a first team selection in the all-around in 2012 ... Harris, a junior, was a second team selection on bars in 2012 ... Aufiero, Gaspar, McGregor and Tang are first time selections.

315 AND COUNTING

In February, Oregon State head coach **Tanya Chaplin** notched the 300th win of her career at Arizona State (2/8). Chaplin, who already is OSU's all-time leader in regular season wins with 253, is the second gymnastics coach in OSU history to reach the 300 win mark in her career and currently sits at 315. Former coach Jim Turpin amassed an overall record of 317-145 (214-69 in the regular season) from 1986-97.

STAMBAUGH CONTINUES ASSAULT ON RECORD BOOK

Senior all-arounder **Makayla Stambaugh** earned another individual titles (floor exercise) last time out at the NCAA Corvallis Regional giving her 22 event titles in 2013, tying for sixth on OSU single season list. Stambaugh moved into sole possession of fourth on OSU's all-time list with 54 career individual titles moving past Leslie Mak (2009-12).

KEEPING GOOD COMPANY

Earlier this season in OSU's home meet against Arizona (Feb. 22) when **Makayla Stambaugh's** vault score of 9.90 flashed on the scoreboard she reached another career milestone and now has career-bests of 9.90 or better on all four events. She becomes one of just seven former OSU gymnasts to record scores of 9.90 on all four events, an impressive group that includes Annie Campbell (2000-02, 04), Jami Lanz (2006-09), Lindsay Nelson (2001-03, 05), Chelsea Plourde (2004-05), Tanya Ricioli-Hebron (2000, 02-04) and Mandi Rodriguez (2007-10).

STAMBAUGH SETS PAC-12 RECORD

Senior all-arounder **Makayla Stambaugh** set the conference record with four straight Pac-12 Gymnast of the Week awards late in the season. With seven GOW awards in her career, she trails only one gymnast in conference history - UCLA senior Vanessa Zamarripa. Most recently Stambaugh scored 39.600, the ninth-highest score in OSU history, in leading the Beavers to victory at the Comfort Suites Invitational. The previous week, Stambaugh helped the Beavers to break the 197-point barrier for the first time in 2013 in a narrow loss at Stanford. Her first two awards came in home meets, first upsetting then-unbeaten UCLA and then in an impressive outing at OSU's annual Pink Out meet. During the four week stretch, Stambaugh posted 10 scores of 9.90 or better including four scores of 9.95. Unfortunately, due to OSU's bye during the week of the regular season she was unable to defend her record going for a fifth straight Pac-12 honor.



ALL-AROUNDERS GALORE

In each of the first three meets of 2013 the Beavers used 12 gymnasts to execute their 24 routines. It was a significant departure from what the Beavers' lineup looked like in 2012, when just eight gymnasts performed for most of the season - including four all-arounders. As the season progressed the Beavers added competitors to the all-around mix going with as many as four at the Metroplex Challenge and against UCLA ... For proof that the lineup was ever-evolving though, the Beavers' last two regular season meets once again featured 12 gymnasts to complete the team's 24 routines. It marked the first time the Beavers have needed a dozen gymnasts since January ... **Makayla Stambaugh** performed all four events in all 12 meets, while **Brittany Harris** joined her at the home opener against Ohio State and remained in the all-around lineup for six meets in a row. Shortly after **Chelsea Tang** entered the picture and performed in the all-around in eight of the last nine meets. **Kelsi Blalock** and **Melanie Jones** each performed in the all-around in 2013.

SENIOR LADEN

While OSU has a youthful squad, the competitive lineup was laden with seniors. At Pac-12 Championships, the Beavers' five seniors performed 13 routines - five vaults, three each on beam and floor and two on bars. For the season, the seniors completed 151 of the Beavers' 287 routines (53%).

SCHEDULING QUIRK

Oregon State has a bit of a quirk in the schedule in 2013 with only four regular season home meets. However, the lack of home events is mitigated by the Beavers hosting Pac-12 Championships Mar. 23 and the NCAA Corvallis Regional Championships as well April 6. With OSU getting through a grueling set of four straight early season meets on the road the Beavers did not have to take after March 1st (at Stanford) until NCAA Championships at UCLA this week.

TO BE THE BEST, YOU'VE GOT TO BEAT THE BEST

As always the Beavers' schedule provides difficult challenges week-in and week-out. Head coach **Tanya Chaplin's** belief that competing against the best competition possible each week helps to prepare her squad for the highest caliber competition in the postseason. OSU faced 17 different opponents over the course of 10 weeks leading up to the Pac-12 Championships and the postseason. Of those opponents 11 were ranked in the NACGC/W Preseason Coaches' Poll and five others received votes.

CHAPLIN NAMES CAPTAINS

Seniors **Melanie Jones**, **Stephanie McGregor** and **Makayla Stambaugh** and junior **Hannah Casey** were chosen as team co-captains for the 2013 season. The foursome was selected in a vote by teammates.

FOUR MORE FOR 2014

In November, four high school seniors signed the National Letters of Intent to join the Oregon State gymnastics program for the 2014 season. Megan Jimenez (Temecula, Calif.), Kana Kobayashi (Salt Lake City, Utah), Kaytianna McMillan (Coburg, Ore.) and Taylor Ricci (North Vancouver, B.C.) are scheduled to enroll at OSU this coming summer ... "We are very excited to sign these four young women. They are talented gymnasts and excellent students with the ability and drive to become the next standouts for the Oregon State gymnastics program," **Tanya Chaplin** said.

TANYA CHAPLIN

Head Coach • 16th Season

Tanya Chaplin has the Oregon State gymnastics program riding one of the greatest waves of success in school history with seven straight appearances at the NCAA Championships. In 2010 and 2011, Chaplin led the Beavers to back-to-back eighth place finishes at the NCAA Championships, the best since her arrival at OSU in 1998. She has led the Beavers to 10 trips to the NCAA Championships overall under her direction. Over the course of her 15 years in Corvallis, 17 OSU gymnasts have earned 38 All-America honors and 14 gymnasts have combined for 23 conference titles. In addition, OSU gymnasts have earned 67 scholastic All-America honors.

Recently Chaplin earned the 300th win of her career and is on the verge of becoming Oregon State's all-time winningest gymnastics coach, just 13 short of Jim Turpin (1986-97). After 15-plus seasons at the helm of the Oregon State gymnastics program, Chaplin's career record stands at a stellar 253-116-2 in the regular season, already a school record for regular season wins, and 314-181-2 overall. During her time at OSU, she has become well-known as one of the best in the business at choreographing her gymnasts' floor and beam routines putting her team in the best possible position to entertain the crowd as well as the judges.

It has become a custom at Oregon State, since Chaplin's arrival, that each season the team is more talented than the year before. Outstanding recruiting classes continue to arrive in Corvallis to meet the challenge of taking OSU to the next level.

In 2012, the Beavers qualified to the NCAA Championships for the seventh straight season, the second-longest streak in OSU history (1987-96), and finished 12th overall. Three gymnasts – Melanie Jones, Leslie Mak and Makayla Stambaugh – combined to garner four All-America honors. Mak enjoyed an incredible season for the second year in a row earning Pac-12 Gymnast of the Year honors, becoming the first gymnast in conference history to collect GOW honors in consecutive seasons. Jones burst onto the national stage with a fantastic year as well earning first team All-America status, for the first time, qualifying for Individual Event Finals where she finished fourth on the floor exercise,

the best OSU finish on the apparatus since 1993. Stambaugh earned second team All-America honors on the floor becoming a four-time All-American.

Prior to moving to Corvallis, Chaplin served as the top assistant coach with the University of Washington gymnastics program for seven years. During that time, the Huskies emerged as one of the top programs in the nation. In 1997, the Huskies placed second at the NCAA West Regional and qualified for the NCAA Championships for the second time in four years.

Chaplin, formerly Tanya Service, went to Washington from her alma mater, UCLA, where she was an assistant coach and standout gymnast.

During her athletic career at UCLA, Chaplin held six school records and received six All-America honors. She was named Pac-10 Gymnast of the Year and UCLA all-university Athlete of the Year in 1987 and 1989.

In addition to her success as a gymnast for the Bruins, Chaplin was a three-time member of the U.S. National Team. She competed at the 1983 World Championships in Budapest, Hungary, where she was a finalist in the all-around competition. She also won a silver medal on floor exercise at the 1987 Olympic Festival and competed in the 1984 Olympic Trials.

Chaplin also served as chair of the USA Gymnastics Athletes Advisory Council from 1996 to 1998, and she spent nine years serving as an athlete representative, working with USA Gymnastics and serving as a voice for the athletes at the 1992 and 1996 Olympic Games.

Chaplin, a native of St. Charles, Mo., graduated from UCLA in 1990 with a degree in political science. Her husband, Michael, is also heading into his 16th season in the role of associate head coach at OSU. The Chaplins have one daughter, Alana.

Oregon State gymnastics coach Tanya Chaplin's people-first focus keeps Beavers among elite

CORVALLIS -- Jen Kesler knew just who to call.

When the former Oregon State gymnast found herself as the only remaining coach of the start-up program at Division II Lindenwood, she went into panic mode.

It was the fall of 2012 and Kesler, who completed her eligibility with the Beavers in the spring of 2011, had signed on to be a graduate assistant at Lindenwood, a small school in St. Charles, Mo., that decided to start a gymnastics program in the wake of excitement from the 2012 Olympics.

Kesler's responsibility was supposed to be limited, but when the head coach and lead assistant resigned right before Lindenwood's season started, Kesler was on her own.

So she dialed Tanya Chaplin, desperate for advice.

Chaplin, in her 16th season at Oregon State, went into coaching mode.

"Tanya is so good at knowing exactly what each of her girls needs at a specific time," Kesler says. "Some people need her to be intense, some people need her to be a little softer toward them. For me, I usually needed a kick in the butt. But this time, I needed a pep talk. I got off the phone and thought, 'If Tanya believes in me, anything is possible.' She gave me so much confidence. That's why people love competing for her."

Kesler's days of competing for OSU might be over, but she'll be in the stands Saturday when the No. 10 Beavers host the Corvallis regional, where six teams will compete for a spot in the NCAA championships. The top two finishers Saturday will head to Los Angeles on April 19-21 with a chance to bring home a national title.

In the past decade, football coach Mike Riley and baseball coach Pat Casey have been praised for their ability to build and maintain Top 25 programs, as outsiders point to disadvantages like Corvallis' location, and OSU's limited funds and often dated facilities. But despite their own hardships, the husband-and-wife team of Michael and Tanya Chaplin have led the most successful women's program in the Oregon State athletic department for the last 15 years.

On Saturday, the Beavers will seek their eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA championships. But because gymnastics is a niche sport traditionally ruled by Southeastern Conference schools, the Beavers often don't get the attention they deserve.

"We are always the underdog," says Kesler, a three-time All-American on the uneven bars. "It's frustrating because so many people count you out because you don't have the best facilities or the biggest city or Olympians on your team or whatever. But it's that much sweeter when you win big meets. And it's because of Michael and Tanya."

When the Chaplins arrived in Corvallis in summer 1997, with Tanya as the head coach and Michael her lead assistant, the gymnastics program was already well established. Former coach Jim Turpin had led the Beavers to 10 consecutive NCAA championship appearances, qualifying for the "Super Six" in 1995 and 1996, but missing the postseason in 1997.

"We came into a place with very high standards," says Tanya, a six-time All-American at UCLA. "It was already a nationally competitive program. It had tradition, great crowds and a beautiful facility that at that time, was pretty new."

The Gladys Valley Gymnastics Center is located smack in the middle of OSU's campus, a quaint, historic building with plenty of character ... and not a lot of space.

"When it was built in 1992 it was awesome, top of the line," Michael says. "And it's still very cool. But in the last 20 years, other schools have not stood still when it comes to upgrading their facilities."

In the past couple years, Utah, UCLA, Arizona and Arizona State have made major improvements to their gymnastics facilities. When OSU senior Makayla Stambaugh went to visit Utah on a recruiting trip, she was awestruck at the floor-to-ceiling windows that overlook the mountains surrounding Salt Lake City.

"I remember thinking, 'Whoa, this is nice,'" recalls Stambaugh. "It was a pretty picturesque place to practice your tumbling."

But like so many other gymnasts, Stambaugh was sold on OSU because of relationships.

The Beavers might not have a state-of-the-art facility (anymore) and might be the only Pac-12 school not located in a major city or near a shopping mall (Washington State, Colorado and USC do not have gymnastics programs), but with the Chaplins, they have success, stability and an ever-growing fan base.

"Michael and Tanya make every person feel so important, and that's not just what it's like when you're on your recruiting visit," Stambaugh says. "When I got here and walked in the practice gym, I thought, 'Ah, I'm home.' That's huge."

The Chaplins say Oregon State sells itself when potential athletes walk around campus

and instantly feel connected to the community.

"When we're trying to convince you to pick OSU we're not selling you a car," Michael says. "We're building a relationship. Looks might be the first impression, but people are most important."

That's a lesson a few OSU recruits learned before they were even on the team.

In Fall 2004, the Chaplins were hosting three recruits when Tanya got a call that Meghan Jones, a walk-on from Medford, had been struck by a car while walking home from a football game. Suffering from severe head trauma and a fractured pelvis, Jones was in critical condition at the hospital, with a 10 percent chance of survival.

Tanya rushed to Jones' side while Michael told the recruits -- and the team -- what was going on. After a long night, Jones came out of a medically induced coma. She would go on to recover fully and graduate. What's more, all three of the recruits from that harrowing weekend committed to Oregon State, including all-arounder Yuki Lamb, who wrote in a letter to the coaches, "I've seen you at your worst. Now I want the opportunity to see you at your best."

"As a recruit, when you're on a visit, I think you wonder a lot, 'Is this real, or is this a show?'" Tanya explains. "That weekend couldn't have been any more real. We talk all the time about how we're not just coaching our athletes in the gym, we're coaching them in life."

Other women's programs at OSU have had spurts of success, but none have shown the sustainability of gymnastics. The Chaplins' continued dominance -- the Beavers have finished in the top 12 each of the last seven years -- has drawn admiration from people like Riley.

"They are two of my favorite people at this university, and they're good for me to talk to," Riley said. "When we talk, I try to just listen. Their approach to recruiting, their ability to find 'the right fit,' the fact that they're nationally ranked every year, it's so impressive. For most of us, there have been peaks and valleys, but to maintain the level they do, in a remote area, they're some of the best coaches in America."

But for all that they've accomplished, the Chaplins are still in search of that elusive trip to the Super Six. They have coached 17 All-Americans in 15 seasons, Tanya is five wins away from becoming the all-time winningest coach in OSU history and they routinely draw some of the biggest crowds in the nation. But never in the Chaplins' tenure has Oregon State advanced past the first day of NCAAs.

"Is winning a national championship our goal? Absolutely," Tanya says. "But just to stay on the brink is so hard. We know what we're doing and we know what this program is about."

"You know, only four programs have ever won the NCAA title," Michael adds. "Georgia, Alabama, UCLA and Utah. That's it. But that hunger is still there, and we're going to fight to the bitter end. But when it's all over, if we don't ever get it, I'm not going to think of us as failures."

"We look up to John Wooden and his philosophies. He won a lot, but that wasn't his focus. We understand there's so much more to it than that."

Kesler agrees.

Though she isn't sure where coaching will lead her, she knows this much: She plans to model her program after OSU.

"Most gymnasts graduate from college and that's it, they're done, they don't like the sport anymore," Kesler said. "They can't wait to get away from it. That's not how it is at OSU, though. All the alums, we love it, we want to be around it. We miss Michael and Tanya and everyone else in the program. Earlier this year the LSU coach, D-D Breaux, told me, 'Just do everything Tanya does at OSU, and you'll be great.'"

"But that was already my plan -- why would I do it any other way?"



Makayla Stambaugh hopes to lead Beavers to Pac-12 Championship in Gill

CORVALLIS -- After 17 years of gymnastics, Makayla Stambaugh thinks she's "finally figured out how to compete."

Good timing. The senior for Oregon State will need to do just that Saturday as the No. 3-seeded Beavers host the Pac-12 Championships at Gill Coliseum.

One of the best all-arounders in the country, Stambaugh is coming off a string of four consecutive conference Gymnast of the Week honors. That might sound like an underwhelming accomplishment, but consider that it's never been done before in the powerhouse Pac-12 Conference.

"Pretty awesome," Stambaugh says.

"Huge," adds Tanya Chaplin, OSU's coach.

But not the goal.

"Individual success is great," Stambaugh says. "But I'm here for team success. And I'm focused on our team winning championships."

The first opportunity to do that comes this weekend at Pac-12s, where OSU is hoping to improve from its last regular-season meet on March 10, when the No.10 Beavers scored a season-high 197.275. A win in Pac-12s would be a nice springboard to NCAA regionals, which OSU is set to host on April 6.

But first up, a conference championship. Stambaugh wants to "go out with a bang" her senior year and knows that will take a solid routine, the right mental framework, and a handful of good jokes.

That's right, after 17 years of competing, Stambaugh has learned that the more fun she's having, the more likely she is to score high.

"We know how to do our routines," says the 5-foot-5 Stambaugh, who scored a career-high 39.600 on March 10. "We practice them for HOURS. At this point, it's all in our heads. I've been focused on having a strong mentality and knowing that when I go up there, I have a job to do. But in between, I'm going to tell jokes and have fun, because that's when I'm good."

That sounds like a good plan to Chaplin.

The Beavers got off to a rough start in 2013, opening with a shockingly low score of 193.600 at a tri-meet in Mexico with Michigan and BYU. OSU missed on six routines, spoiling its opener. Chaplin called the debut "a disaster."

"The playfulness wasn't there that meet," she says. "But as a team they've grown a lot throughout the season and they've all learned to have that playfulness and how to relax, and now the seniors are passing it down to the younger athletes. In our sport, when you're able to enjoy your routine it allows your body to do what it naturally knows how to do. And that's definitely to your advantage."

That's something Stambaugh has learned over time. A standout gymnast at Byers Gymnastics Center outside of Sacramento, Stambaugh was recruited hard by OSU, Utah and LSU. She was smitten with Oregon State from the get-go, and said it was easy to pick Corvallis when she got to know Tanya and Michael Chaplin. Previously a six-time Junior Olympic national champion, Stambaugh has racked up an impressive list of accomplishments in her four years on campus, earning All-American status each season.

And she's happy with her life outside of the gym: Stambaugh is dating Johnny Hekker, the former OSU punter now playing with the St. Louis Rams. Being in a relationship with another athlete has its drawbacks, Stambaugh says, but overall she views it as a good thing because she and Hekker "keep each other grounded, encourage each other and push each other."

As for her improvement over the last couple seasons, Stambaugh admits that Hekker might have played a role.

"I guess I can give him some credit," she laughs. "He's helped me understand how to be a better teammate, and he's really helped with my mental framework, and that's what gymnastics is. Obviously I have the abilities, but I have to remember to dwell on victorious thoughts. He helps me with that, and he reminds me why I'm doing all this, why I'm putting in all these hours -- it's because I love it."

Tang helps keep Beavs on the beam

In January 2009, the Oregon State gymnastics team faced off against Arkansas in Corvallis, a meet that featured two of the best amateur gymnasts to come out of Eugene — Beaver senior Jami Lanz and Razorback junior Casey Jo Magee.

A large, loud, sign-waving contingent of young gymnasts from Eugene's National Academy of Artistic Gymnastics, the club team and training ground for both Lanz and Magee, filled a section of Gill Coliseum. Among them was Chelsea Tang, a talented sophomore from South Eugene High School who verbally committed to Oregon State later that same year.

"Growing up I always came to the meets with my teammates, and we always said we wanted to do college gymnastics," Tang said. "When I came to (Oregon State), I fell in love with it."

Now a sophomore, Tang has successfully made the transition from her seat in the stands to a starring role for No. 10 Oregon State, and the spotlight will be on her come Saturday when the Beavers host an NCAA regional meet at Gill Coliseum at 4 p.m.

The six-team meet will include No. 4 Georgia, No. 16 Arkansas, No. 21 Boise State, Arizona State and California. The top two finishers will advance to the NCAA championship meet, April 19-21 in Los Angeles.

Tang will play an important role for the Beavers (20-6), who are coming off a win at the Pac-12 championship two weeks ago and are seeking their eighth straight NCAA berth.

After a sprained elbow limited her as a freshman, the 5-foot-3 Tang has emerged this season as a standout all-around performer, recording career bests in every event — 9.90 (vault), 9.90 (beam), 9.874 (uneven bars), 9.875 (floor) and 39.400 (all-around). She also was named first-team all-Pac-12 on beam.

"I didn't help out the team much last year, so being able to do more events this year and see my training pay off has been really nice," Tang said. "I came into the season healthy, and staying healthy has really helped."

Tang has been the Beavers' most consistent all-around gymnast behind senior Makayla Stambaugh, who is ranked No. 13 in the nation.

Tang led the team with a score of 38.925 at the Pac-12 championship meet and also picked up wins on the uneven bars against Arizona State on Feb. 8, and on the beam at the Comfort Suites Invitational on March 9.

"She's a beautiful gymnast," OSU coach Tanya Chaplin said. "I'm seeing her confidence grow, which is great. I don't know if she realizes how strong of an athlete she really is, but she has so many great things about her. She's a really hard worker and it's starting to pay off."

Tang's favorite event is the beam, a discipline that perfectly combines her ability to focus with her athletic talent.

"I love all four events, but beam has always come kind of easy for me," Tang said. "Beam is really mental, especially when you're up in front of thousands of people. You just have to keep calm."

Before OSU, Tang was a national champion for NAAG and coach Linda Mulvihill, winning the Junior Olympic title on the uneven bars in 2010. The following year she finished fourth in the all-around at the Junior Olympics.

Chaplin, who kept a watchful eye on her recruit during those final years of high competition at the Junior Olympic level, liked what she saw in regards to Tang's ability to successfully navigate each event, which has only improved in her two years in Corvallis.

"With Chelsea, she's emotionally in control in every event," Chaplin said. "With some athletes, you can see the anxiety go up on certain event, but Chelsea really has a consistency on every event. She doesn't change."

But circumstances do. And now Tang is the one signing autographs after meets and thrilling the kids at NAAG when she goes back for a visit.

"I remember (Lanz and Magee) coming in every once in awhile," Tang said. "They were always the big girls that everyone always looked up to. They would come in every once in awhile and you could talk to them a little bit. . . . It's nice that you can inspire little girls. And I know because I used to be one of them."
