Walker says... "Ashley is one of those kind of quiet players that just sits back and figures things out and watches what's going on and then tries to jump in and compete. But the one thing about Ashley is she's a competitor and she wants to be out there everyday. We've seen a lot of growth in her so far. She's got a lot of experience to gain in terms of playing at this level as a freshman, but she has all the tools to be a major player and contribute to this program in a major way physically. We expect her to get quite a bit of opportunity, possibly getting some starting time if she gets everything going well and competes hard."
