**GAME 50: NO. 4 WASHINGTON (35-9, 8-6 PAC-10)** — Friday, May 1 (3:00 p.m.): Oregon State is 15-42 all-time against Washington. The Huskies took both of the meetings earlier this season.


Washington is coming off of a 1-2 weekend in Arizona, falling to Arizona State on Friday before splitting with Arizona on Saturday and Sunday. Senior Ashley Charters continues to lead the Washington offense with a .459 batting average, 67 total hits

and 46 runs. She boasts 28 stolen bases and seven home runs, having been walked 21 times and reaching 100 total bases on Saturday. Junior pitcher Danielle Lawrie continues to dominate in the circle with a 0.78 ERA, 1.57 in Pac-10 play, amassing 325 strikeouts on 215.0 innings pitched with 15 shut-outs and holding opponents to a .123 batting average. The Huskies are undefeated at home this season, posting a 9-0 record. Washington and UCLA will square off on Wednesday in a single game to wrap up the series at 1:00 p.m.

**GAMES 51 & 52: NO. 2 UCLA (35-8, 10-4 PAC-10)** — Saturday & Sunday, May 2 & 3 (3:00 & 12:00 p.m.): Oregon State is 10-76 all-time against UCLA. The Bruins earned the first win of the series earlier this month.

The Bruins are riding a nine-game winning streak, all conference match-ups, including sophomore Monica Harrison's school record setting performance of three home runs over No. 4 Arizona State on Sunday. Sophomore Katie Schroeder leads the Bruin offense with a .410 batting average with six other batters hitting above .300. Schroeder leads the team

in hits (55), runs (45), home runs (13), walks (29), stolen bases (17) and on base percentage (.533). Junior Megan Langenfeld has emerged as possibly the conference's top pitcher, posting a perfect 11-0 record with a 1.11 ERA, 1.25 in conference play. Langenfeld posts three complete game shutouts, two combined, three saves and 74 strikeouts on 88.2 innings pitched, holding opponents to a .117 batting average. UCLA is 9-4 at home this season.

**LOOKING BACK AT LAST WEEK** — Oregon State set a new school record for double plays, turning its 29th on Sunday. But the Beavers went 2-3 on the weekend, taking Thursday's doubleheader against UC Davis but falling to No. 15 California and No. 4 Stanford.

Senior **Paige Lowe** turned the school record 29th double play unassisted catching a line drive and catching the runner at second off base. She has 21 on the season.

Sophomore **Audrey Roderfeld** blasted a pair on back-to-back days with one coming against the Golden Bears on Friday and the next coming against the Cardinal on Saturday. Roderfeld went 2-for-2 with a run and a walk in Saturday's game.

Freshman **Ashley Sanchez** tallied three straight multi-hit games, beginning with Thursday's doubleheader. With those games, she now has a team-leading 12 multi-hit games on the season.

Junior **Kelly Dyer** posted her fifth save of the season, one shy of the national leader at the beginning of the week. Her saves tie her for the third most in a single season and tied for sixth on the career list.

**NATIONAL ATTENTION** — As a team, Oregon State is ranked nationally in three categories. The Beavers are second in the nation in double plays turned (0.59 DPPG), 36th for fielding percentage (0.969) and 89th for home runs per game (0.63 HRPG) in the latest NCAA ranking summary, released April 7. Junior **Kelly Dyer** is fifth in the nation for saves with five on the season.

**IT'S ALL ABOUT THE TEAM** — The Beavers tied the school record for most home runs in a single game on Wednesday, Mar. 25, in the second game of the doubleheader against Seattle with five. The original record was set in 2003 against Portland State.

**LOWE CAREER WATCH** — Senior **Paige Lowe** has jumped onto the career stolen bases list with 27 currently in her career, good for eighth all-time.

**RODERFELD RIPS 'EM** — Sophomore **Audrey**

**Roderfeld** broke into the career record books with her 15th career home run against No. 6 Arizona State on Saturday, Mar. 28, good to tie for 10th. Roderfeld amassed eight last season and already has 12 this season, hitting four in one week over five games. She currently is tied for fourth on the single season list and ninth on the career list.

**SCHOOL RECORD DEFENSE** — Senior **Paige Lowe** and the rest of the team set a new school record, while tying the NCAA single game record, turning four double plays against Kansas on February 19. The Beavers set a new single season record on April 26, turning their 29th. Lowe has helped to turn 21, including the 29th unassisted. The Beavers second most was three against Arizona State on February 22, 2007 with **DeAnn Young** being apart of all three turned. The previous team season record was 28, set in 2003.

**RPI RANKINGS** — Oregon State is currently 63rd in the most recent RPI rankings, released April 21. The Beavers finished the 2008 season ranked 70th.

**HOME OPENERS** — Oregon State has won its home opener for the last six seasons with the win over Oregon being its first conference and home opener of those six.

**MAJOR MILESTONE** — Head coach **Kirk Walker** earned his 500th career win against Minnesota on Sunday, Mar. 1 at the CSUF DiMarini Invitational. Walker reached 400 on March 25, 2006, when Oregon State rallied for a 2-1 eight-inning win against BYU in the Beavers' home opener.

**SEASON OPENERS** — Oregon State is 10-13 in its season opener since 1987. Under head coach **Kirk Walker**, the Beavers are 7-8. The last time Oregon State won its season opener was in 2005 at UC Santa Barbara.

**POINTS IN THE POLL** — Oregon State received one vote in the USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 Poll, released on March 3. The vote places the Beavers 35th. In the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 poll, released March 3, the Beavers received one vote, tied for 33rd.

**TOUGH COMPETITION** — The Oregon State softball team will continue with its tradition of a tough schedule. In 2009, the Beavers will face 18 teams from the 2008 NCAA Tournament (three of those being College World Series teams), 13 from the NFCA Preseason Top 25 with four of those being in the top 10. Oregon State will face three more that received votes in the poll.

to finish tied for seventh this season with 10 votes in the Pac-10 Coaches Preseason Poll. UCLA was voted tow in the conference with three first place votes and 43 total points. Arizona State was second with 41 points and two first place votes, and Washington is predicted to finish third with two first place votes and 36 total. Arizona, Stanford and California follow, and Oregon was the other team to receive 10 votes.

**TICKET INFORMATION** — Tickets are available for home softball games by walk-up purchase only at the OSU Softball Complex. Ticket prices are \$6 for adults and \$4 for seniors and children. Admission is free for Oregon State students with valid ID card.

**2008 RECAP** — The 2008 softball season was one full of expectations and record setting performances by the Beavers, led by senior utility player and two-time All-American, Cambria Miranda. Miranda earned her fourth All-Pac-10 nod with second team honors to lead four others on the All-Pac-10 teams. Junior Paige Lowe, who also was the lone Beaver to receive All-Pacific Region honors, sophomores Dani Chisholm and Kelly Dyer and freshman Erin Guzy all earned honorable mention. Guzy added Pac-10 All-Freshmen Team honors with Audrey Roderfeld joining her. Freshman McKenna Lowe earned All-Freshman Honorable Mention. Roderfeld was the lone Oregon State player to earn Pac-10 Player of the Week honors for Mar. 11-17. The 2008 season held highlights of nearly defeating the No. 1 team in the country, Arizona State, at home in a 12-inning thriller, taking the series from No. 23 Washington and Oregon and upsetting No. 3 UCLA in the final weekend of the season, but the team came up just short of its 10th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance with a 28-31 record.

**OSU SOFTBALL COMPLEX** — The Oregon State softball complex opened in April of 2001. The \$1.5 million dollar complex features 750 bleacher backed seats, a concession and restroom facility, as well as one of the top playing surfaces in the nation. The sunken dugouts each contain a restroom for players as well as large storage areas. The press box facility, one of the best in the Pac-10, allows ample seating for six scorers in the main booth with two smaller television/radio booths located on

softball program, a program that has made a monumental turnaround under his direction. Walker reigns as Oregon State's all-time winningest softball coach with a 490-378-3 career record. He earned his 400th career coaching victory on March 25, 2006 when Oregon State rallied for a 2-1 eight-inning win against BYU in the Beavers' home opener. The Beavers have routinely beaten nationally-ranked teams and have shown improvement every season since Walker's arrival. His teams have won 40-plus games eight times.

Turning Oregon State into a perennial national contender, Walker led the Beavers to their first ever appearance in the NCAA Women's College World Series during the 2006 campaign. One of the best teams in Oregon State history, Walker's 2006 squad reeled off a school record 28-game winning streak (the longest for any team in the nation on the season), catapulted to a program-best No. 5 national ranking, and won both the NCAA Regional and Super Regional to earn a WCWS berth. Oregon State finished the year with a 43-16 record.
