## THE OPENING KICK

### TERPS OPEN 2014 SEASON WITH TWO-MATCH CALIFORNIA ROAD TRIP


- The Maryland (0-0) women's soccer team opens its 2014 season with a two-match road trip to California. The Terps open the season at defending NCAA champion UCLA, which is ranked No. 1 in the preseason NSCAA poll. Maryland and the Bruins are slated for a 10 p.m. EST start at Drake Stadium on Friday, Aug. 22. The Terrapins wrap up their West Coast swing with a 4 p.m. EST match at Pepperdine on Sunday, Aug. 24 at Tari Frahm Rokus Field
- This marks the first time since 2003 the Terps opened the season with their first two matches on the West Coast. In 2003 Maryland played in an ACC/Pac-10 Challenge with matches at Washington and vs. Washington State. Maryland dropped the opener to the Huskies, 2-1, but topped the Cougars, 3-0, to earn a split.
- Maryland is coming off of a 2013 season that saw the Terps finish with a 10-10-0 record and an eighth-place finish in the ACC. The defense returns five of six starters to anchor the 2014 squad. Junior **Rachelle Beanlands** started all 20 matches for the Terps in goal and finished with a 1.49 goals-against average. The back line returns senior **Shade Pratt** and juniors **Shannon Collins** and **Erika Nelson**. Collins is the lone player on the Maryland roster to start every match during the past two seasons. Junior **Sarah Fichtner** returned to the field after battling injuries for the previous two seasons and started 14 of the 19 matches she appeared in at holding center mid. Sophomore **Lauren Berman** is the team's leading returning scorer after totaling 11 points on three goals and five assists. Juniors **Aubrey Baker** and **Alex Doody** also scored three goals in 2013, while Collins led the team with six assists.

### SCOUTING THE BRUINS

- UCLA is coming off of a 2013 season that saw the Bruins capture the program's first NCAA championship. UCLA finished 2013 with a 22-1-3 mark and are ranked No. 1 in the NSCAA's preseason poll for 2014.
- Sophomore forward Darian Jenkins returns to lead the Bruins' offense after totaling 27 points on 11 goals and five assists as a freshman. Defensively, senior goalkeeper Katelyn Rowland returns in net for UCLA after posting a 0.27 goals-against average with 15 solo shutouts last season.
- Head Coach Amanda Cromwell is just in her second season at the helm of the UCLA program and has a 22-1-3 (.904) record. Overall, Cromwell has been a head coach for 15 seasons and is 225-84-29 (.709) overall.

### SCOUTING THE WAVE

- Pepperdine is coming off of a 2013 season that saw the Wave finish with a 10-7-2 mark, but did not earn an at-large bid to the NCAA tournament despite a fourth-place finish in the West Coast Conference.
- Senior forward Lynn Williams returns to lead Pepperdine's offense after totaling 25 points on 11 goals and three assists in 2013. Defensively, sophomore goalkeeper Katelyn Rowland started all 19 matches in 2013 and had a 1.40 goals-against average with five shutouts.
- Head Coach Tim Ward is in his 17th season at Pepperdine and has led the Wave to a 183-97-41 mark during that time.



# JONATHAN MORGAN

HEAD COACH • THIRD SEASON AT MARYLAND • ROWAN '95

Jonathan Morgan was promoted to the head coach of the Maryland women's soccer program on February 10, 2012 after helping lead the Terrapin team to three-straight NCAA tournament appearances.

He continued Maryland's string of successful seasons in his first as the Terrapins' head coach, leading the team to a second-place finish in the ACC and a runner-up finish in the ACC tournament. The 2012 senior class also became the first graduating class to have defeated every ACC program during their collegiate careers. The Terps earned their fourth-straight bid to the NCAA tournament in Morgan's first season as head coach as a No. 4 seed.

Morgan's 2013 Terrapin team was highlighted by the brilliance of senior Hayley Brock, who culminated her three-year Maryland career by finishing among the top 10 on the career points, goals, assists, shots and game-winning goals lists.

Prior to taking over as head coach, Morgan served as an assistant coach with Terrapins for five seasons (2007-11) and helped lead a resurgence that saw the Terps earn two trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2009, 2011), the program's first-ever No. 1 seed in the NCAA tournament (2010) and a berth in the ACC tournament championship game (2010).

In the five seasons Morgan served as an assistant coach at Maryland, the Terrapins boasted a record of 57-33-13 (.617), including a mark of 44-14-9 (.724) over the last three seasons, while playing in the nation's premier women's soccer conference.

Morgan was instrumental in recruiting the 2012 freshman class, which was ranked No. 5 in the nation by TopDrawerSoccer.com and includes two state Gatorade Players of the Year. He also led the recruiting effort for the 2008 freshman class, which was ranked No. 14 in the nation and featured All-American Jasmyne Spencer and Ashley Grove, who each finished among the top 10 in career goals and points at Maryland.

During his five seasons as a Terrapin assistant, Morgan has been primarily responsible for coordinating and training the team's defense, which included 2010 ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year Caitlin McDowell. He also helped coordinate the overall administration of the program, including academic support, scheduling, maintaining the operating budget, equipment, financial aid and fundraising.

Morgan also serves as the head coach of the Bethesda Soccer Club U17 girls, which is currently ranked No. 3 in the nation by Gotsoccer.com. During his tenure with BSC, Morgan has coached several players who have gone on to play with U.S. Youth National and USYSA Regional Teams.

Prior to coming to College Park, Morgan spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State (2005-06) where he was primarily responsible for recruiting and working with the Buckeyes' offensive attack. Under Morgan's tutelage the Buckeyes finished third in the Big Ten in points per game with a 4.84 ppg average.

The 2006 Buckeyes boasted the Big Ten conference's statistical individual leader in goals, goals per game, points per game, assists and assists per game in Lara Dickenmann, a two-time NSCAA All-American.

While in Columbus, Ohio, Morgan was the head coach of the Ohio Premier (OP) U15 girls club team.

Prior to coaching at Ohio State, Morgan spent three seasons as a volunteer coach at Rutgers, where he helped the Scarlet Knights to postseason appearances in 2002, '03 and '04. Among his responsibilities were assisting the coaching staff in developing and organizing all individual and team training sessions, as well as helping with recruiting, including the planning and directing of all official visits. During his tenure at Rutgers, Morgan helped coach Carli Loyd, a three-time NSCAA All-American, four-time first team All-Big East selection and full U.S. National Team player.

From 2001-05 Morgan was a staff coach for the Players Development Academy (PDA). During his time at PDA he coached four different teams between the ages of U12-U18. He had the privilege of coaching more than 40 future Division I student-athletes, three U.S. Youth National Team players and 10 USYSA regional team players.

A native of Dover, Del., Morgan was a four-year starter at Rowan College in Glassboro, N.J., serving as team captain his senior season with the Profs. After he finished his playing career, he broke into the college coaching ranks with his alma mater in 1995, helping the Rowan men's team to a 17-1-3 mark, a No. 4 national ranking and an appearance in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

He has also been involved with the Olympic Development Programs in Delaware and New Jersey, leading the New Jersey ODP girl's U-17 team to the Region 1 ODP championship in 2001. The team earned a trip to the ODP National championships and placed third. During his time with the New Jersey ODP program, Morgan helped coach U.S. Women's National Team players Heather O'Reilly and Jillian Loyden.

Morgan's ODP experience also includes being a part of the USYSA Region 1 staff from 2002-05.

A USSF "B" licensed and KNVB Dutch Certificate coach, Morgan graduated from Rowan in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in law/justice. He currently resides in Laurel, Md.

## GAME NOTES

### MARYLAND IN SEASON OPENERS

- Maryland has a 17-8-2 (.643) lifetime record in season openers dating back to the 1987 season.
- The Terps are undefeated in their last 10 season openers and have an 8-0-2 mark over that stretch. Maryland has not allowed even a goal during those 10 openers and has outscored its opponents 29-0 since 2004 in season openers.

### VS. RANKED OPPONENTS IN SEASON OPENERS

- This season marks the seventh time in Maryland's 28 seasons the Terps will open the season vs. a ranked opponent.
- Maryland is 2-4-0 in the previous six season openers vs. ranked opponents, but the Terrapins have won the last two.
- The match vs. UCLA will be the third time Maryland has faced a defending NCAA champion in the season opener. The Terps faced off with North Carolina in 1993 and 1994 when the Tar Heels were the defending champs.

### WEST COAST TRIPS

- This season marks the third time Maryland has opened a season with a road trip on the West Coast or beyond.
- The last time the Terps headed west to start a season was 2003, which also happens to be the last time Maryland lost a season opener. The Terrapins played at Washington in the ACC/Pac-10 Challenge on August 29. The Huskies' Tina Frimpong scored the game-winning goals in the 106th minute to win the match 2-1. Maryland evened its record at 1-1 with a 3-0 win over Washington State two days later. Sophomore Kimmy Francis scored twice in the victory for the Terps.
- The first time Maryland opened a season out west was 1996 and the Terps went even farther west than the West Coast. The No. 7 Terrapins played in Honolulu, Hawaii in the Hawaii Tournament on August 30 and September 1. Maryland earned a pair of 1-0 wins over St. Mary's in the opener and host Hawaii in the finale.


### 129 AND COUNTING AT LUDWIG FIELD

- The Terps won their 100th match at Ludwig Field with a 6-0 victory over Iona on Aug. 20, 2010. Since its opening in 1995, Ludwig Field has proved to be a tremendous home-field advantage for the Terps women's soccer team. All-time Maryland is 129-53-21 (.687) at Ludwig Field.

### NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- Dating back to its 10-0 win over Mount St. Mary's in 2008, Maryland has lost only six times in its last 44 matches vs. non-ACC opponents. The Terps have outscored its non-conference opposition 123-25 in those 44 matches.
- The Terps recorded 20 straight wins over non-conference foes before tying Georgetown, 1-1, in second round of the NCAA tournament in 2010. Maryland is now 34-6-4 in its last 44 non-conference games. The Terps had been unbeaten in 31-straight non-conference games prior to losing, 1-0, at Oklahoma State in the Sweet 16 of the 2011 NCAA tournament.
