**CORVALLIS — Sean Mannion** passed for 422 yards and **Brandin Cooks** and **Storm Woods** each scored twice.

The Eagles went ahead on a 2-yard touchdown run by quarterback Vernon Adams with 18 seconds left. The Beavers managed to get to EWU's 35-yard line where **Trevor Romaine's** 52-yard field goal sailed wide right as the game ended.

Oregon State had a big offensive day, led by Mannion and Cooks who both found themselves in the top 10 in a couple single-game categories. Mannion's 422 yards passing is the sixth-best total in school history and his 37 completions were just three shy of his school-record 40 achieved against Arizona State during the 2011 season.

Cooks, meanwhile, caught 13 passes for 196 yards. He ties Shane Morales (2008) and Jacquizz Rodgers (2009) for the second-most receptions in a single game and finished just one shy of tying Mike Hass' record 14 against Arizona State in 2004.

Cooks' 196 yards receiving are good for ninth-most.

Eastern Washington held a 29-17 lead entering halftime, and the teams battled back-and-forth for most of the second half. Cooks and Woods scored on a 7-yard pass and 3-yard rush, respectively, to give the Beavers a 32-29 lead late in the third quarter. EWU, however, moved ahead 36-32 when Adams ran for a 19-yard score

with 1:29 remaining in the quarter.


Cooks scored his second touchdown of the game less than two minutes into the fourth quarter when Mannion found him for a 14-yard pass. Adams, however, connected with Blair Bomber on a 47-yard touchdown pass three minutes later.

Oregon State scored its final touchdown with 4:50 remaining. **Terron Ward** scampered into the end zone on a 4-yard rush on a 12-play drive that lasted 5:27.

Michael Doctor (40, below) made 11 tackles including two sacks against the Eagles, while Connor Hamlett (89, right), had a career day with eight receptions for 85 yards and a touchdown.

**CORVALLIS** — Sean Mannion passed for 372 yards and four touchdowns and Brandin Cooks caught two touchdowns through the air to lead Oregon State past Hawaii, 33-14.

Mannion threw two scores to Cooks in the third quarter to break away from UH, which had scored two touchdowns in the second quarter to catch the Beavers going into the half. Oregon State was up 14-0 after both Richard Mullaney and Kellen Clute caught their first career touchdowns in the first quarter.

Both of Mannion's third-quarter touchdown passes to Cooks went for 8 yards. The first found Cooks in the middle of the end zone with 10:18 remaining, capping a nearly five-minute drive.

The second saw Cooks streaking toward the back right of the end zone less than five minutes later. The second score put the Beavers up 28-14 and in the driver's seat.

The Oregon State defense took care of UH in the second half. Devon Kell's fourth-quarter safety and an interception by Steven Nelson — the team's first takeaway of the year — later on in the fourth held Hawaii scoreless. OSU's second-half dominance netted the Beaver defense its first scoreless second half since shutting down Utah in the sixth game of the 2012 season.

Mannion's afternoon saw the junior connect on 31-of-43 passes for 372 yards. His four touchdown passes gave him 38 for his career, tying him with Sean Canfield for the fourth-most by an OSU quarterback.

In two games, Mannion has completed 68-of-86 passes for 794 yards — a completion

percentage of 79.

Cooks, meanwhile, tied for the team lead in receptions with Storm Woods; each had seven. Cooks tallied 92 yards, just eight shy of recording his second consecutive 100-yard game.


Woods led the Beavers with 95 yards receiving, and added 50 yards rushing on 17 carries.

The OSU defense limited UH to 239 yards of total offense while OSU managed 508. The Beavers' defense picked up three sacks, led by Scott Crichton's 1.5.

Mana Rosa recorded seven tackles to lead the Beavers, while Joel Skotte had six.

Hawaii's quarterback Taylor Graham was 10-for-20 for 95 yards and one score while Sean Schroeder, who came on in the second half, was 8-for-12 for 75 yards and one interception.

Richard Mullaney (pointing, below) scored his first touchdown of the season early in the second quarter on a 19-yard pass from Sean Mannion. It was Mannion's second of four scoring tosses on the day. Steven Nelson (2, right) made the first interception of his OSU career and created the first turnover of the season for the Beavers.



**SALT LAKE CITY — Sean Mannion** converted two crucial fourth downs in the fourth quarter and then threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to **Brandin Cooks** in overtime to push the Beavers past Utah 51-48.

Mannion completed 27 of 44 passes for 443 yards and five touchdowns in a back-and-forth thriller. Cooks had nine receptions for 210 yards and three scores as the Beavers (2-1, 1-0 Pac-12) overcame the loss of tailback **Storm Woods** to a concussion and opened conference play with a road win.

Travis Wilson passed for 279 yards and ran for 142 and three touchdowns while rallying the Utes (2-1, 0-1 Pac-12) from 13 points down to tie the score at 45-45 on a 9-yard run with 21 seconds to play.

On fourth-and-nine from the OSU 22-yard-line, Mannion completed a 13-yard pass to **Richard Mullaney**. The drive culminated in an 18-yard touchdown reception by Cooks. A two-point conversion pass to **Connor Hamlett** gave OSU a 45-38 lead with 2:29 to play in regulation.

Earlier in the quarter, on fourth-and-1 at their own 45, the Beavers used razzle-dazzle to keep their advantage. Mannion pitched the ball to **Terron Ward**, who threw it back across the field to the quarterback, who in turn launched it 48 yards to **Brandin Cooks**. The play led to Romaine's 20-yard field goal, his third of the game.

**Sean Martin** intercepted Wilson on the first drive of the second half and returned it 27 yards for a touchdown and **Steven Nelson** re-

corded two interceptions in the second half.


Mullaney finished with a career-best seven receptions for 142 yards.

The last time Oregon State won in Salt Lake City was a 24-21 victory in 1968.

Brandin Cooks (7, below) had nine catches for a career-high 210 yards and scored three touchdowns including this game-winner in overtime in Salt Lake City. Sean Mannion (4, right) threw for 443 yards and five touchdowns including the game-winner in overtime.

**SAN DIEGO** — Steven Nelson's interception late in the game - his fourth of the season - was his biggest of the 2013 season.

The cornerback returned the interception 16 yards for a touchdown to send the Beavers to a 34-30 comeback victory over San Diego State.

San Diego State quarterback Quinn Kaehler tried a swing pass deep in the Aztecs' territory, but misfired on his attempted target. The pass went wide and right into the hands of Nelson, who returned the ball for an easy score, sending the Beavers to the comeback victory.

Oregon State found itself down nine with 5:18 remaining after a 30-yard field goal by SDSU's Wes Feer.

The Beavers immediately drove down the field, with **Sean Mannion** connecting on a 10-yard touchdown pass to **Terron Ward** with less than three minutes remaining. The touchdown highlighted a 10-play, 81-yard drive that lasted a little more than two-and-a-half minutes.

**Trevor Romaine**, instead of attempting an onside kick, drove the immediate kickoff into the SDSU end zone for a touchback, essentially setting up the game-winning interception.

Mannion threw for 367 yards and three touchdowns on the strength of 38-for-55 passing. It was his sixth career 350-plus game, and the 38 completions were just two shy of tying his program-record 40 against Arizona State in 2011.

Fourteen of Mannion's 38 completions went to **Brandin Cooks**, who tied Mike Hass for the most in a single game by an OSU player. Cooks ended the game with 141 yards through the air.

Mannion's first touchdown pass was a 2-yarder to **Kellen Clute** with 2:03 remaining in the first quarter. It put the Beavers (3-1 overall) up 14-7, but that lead did not last long as the Aztecs scored just 17 seconds later on an 80-yard reception by Colin Lockett.


SDSU (0-3) went into halftime with a 24-14 advantage after Feer connected on a 45-yard field goal and Adam Muema scored on a 2-yard rush with 3:35 remaining.

The Beavers, after Feer hit a 40-yard field goal with 1:55 left in the third, opened scoring in the fourth quarter when Mannion connected on another 2-yard pass, this one going to **Kevin Cummings**. It brought the Beavers to within six, 27-21.

Steven Nelson (2, below) intercepted an Aztec pass and returned it 16 yards to paydirt for the game-winning score with 2:31 left in the contest. Kellen Clute (83, right) scored his second touchdown of the season late in the first quarter.

**CORVALLIS — Sean Mannion** keeps etching his name into the Oregon State record books.

The junior passed for a school-record six touchdowns and 414 yards in Oregon State's 44-17 win over Colorado at Reser Stadium.

Mannion surpassed the previous record of five he had met earlier in the season in the Beavers' win over Utah. He found **Brandin Cooks** and **Caleb Smith** in the end zone twice, and one apiece to **Terron Ward** and **Connor Hamlett** in helping guide the Beavers to a 4-1 record.

Mannion, who completed 27-of-52 pass attempts on the day, broke the school record on a one-play drive in the fourth quarter. **Ryan Murphy** intercepted a Colorado pass and returned it to the Buffaloes' 11-yard line. Mannion connected with Hamlett for the record-breaking score.

His two touchdowns to Cooks - coming late in the second quarter and early in the third - supplanted the duo as one of the most dangerous in the country. Cooks has nine touchdown receptions on the year and has caught 16 touchdowns from

Mannion all-time - one shy of Erik Wilhelm and Robb Thomas' program-record 17.

Cooks caught nine passes for 168 yards, with 140 coming in the first half.


Ward also had a big day for the Beavers, collecting 103 yards receiving, with 42 on a third-quarter touchdown with 6:48 remaining. He also rushed for 55 yards on 19 carries.

Smith caught two touchdowns, making the most of his three receptions on the day. He caught a 3-yarder from Mannion with 2:09 left in the first quarter, then made it 38-3 in favor of the Beavers with a 4-yarder less than two minutes after Ward scored on a dump pass.

The Oregon State defense was stout, holding Colorado to 300 yards of total offense. The Beavers intercepted two passes - one apiece by Murphy and **Rashaad Reynolds** - and also recovered two fumbles on kickoffs.

**Tyreek Zimmerman**, who had a 16-yard sack in the third quarter, led the Beavers with seven tackles. **Scott Crichton** had two tackles for loss and pass breakups were recorded by **Steven Nelson**, **Mana Rosa** and **Devon Kell**.

**PULLMAN, Wash.** — Sean Mannion passed for a school-record 493 yards, Brandin Cooks scored three touchdowns and Oregon State scored 28 points in the fourth quarter for a 52-24 win over Washington State.

Mannion surpassed the previous record holder, Derek Anderson, by 8 yards and broke the record with a 30-yard touchdown pass to Cooks in the fourth quarter. It was the 18th touchdown all-time between the two, making them the most prolific tandem in school history.

Mannion, who completed 34-of-51 passes and threw for four touchdowns, also found Cooks in the end zone on an 8-yard strike less than four minutes earlier, which came with just under seven minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

Other strikes by Mannion came on a 7-yarder to Connor Hamlett and a 7-yard pass to Kevin Cummings with a little more than a minute remaining in the third quarter.

Storm Woods scored twice on the ground, coming from 1 and 3 yards out, respectively, and Cooks rushed for an 8-yard touchdown just five seconds into the fourth quarter to represent OSU's other scores.

Cooks' 8-yard touchdown rush came two plays after a game-changing botched fake punt by Washington State that set the Beavers up on the Cougars' 27-yard line. Cooks' score gave the Beavers the lead for good, 31-24.

OSU broke the game open with Woods' 1-yard rush

just 1:08 after Cooks' touchdown. Rashaad Reynolds intercepted his first of two passes in the fourth quarter to set up the touchdown.

WSU turned the ball over five times in the fourth quarter; Reynolds intercepted two passes and caused one fumble (two in the game) and Sean Martin and Steven Nelson each intercepted a pass. The Beavers out-gained the Cougars, 169 to 50, in the fourth.

Cooks led the Beavers overall with 11 receptions for 137 yards, giving him 63 receptions and 944 receiving yards on the year.

Richard Mullaney also hit the century mark, finishing with 122 yards on five catches, all in the first half.



**BERKELEY, Calif. - Brandin Cooks** caught 13 passes for 232 yards and **Sean Mannion** passed for 481 yards and four scores as the Beavers became bowl eligible with a 49-17 win over California.

The Beavers improved to 6-1 on the year and 4-0 in Pac-12 Conference play. The win kept Oregon State as one of two teams in the Pac-12 with a perfect league mark. Cal, meanwhile, dropped to 1-6 overall and 0-4 in league contests.

Cooks tallied 197 receiving yards at the half and finished with a career-best 232 yards receiving, which also stands as the second-best single-game mark in OSU history, trailing only Mike Hass' 293 against Boise State in 2004.

Cooks caught a 34-yard pass from Mannion in the second quarter and rushed for a 15-yard score less than five minutes prior.

Mannion, meanwhile followed up his school record performance the previous week with another strong outing. His 481 yards passing ranked third in OSU history and his four touchdowns gave him 29 on the year, which tied him with Derek Anderson (2004) for the most in a single season.

The OSU junior completed 35-of-45 passes (77.7 percent), and his 481 yards gave him 2,992 on the year. Mannion found **Caleb Smith** for a 14-yard score with nine seconds remaining in the first quarter to put the Beavers up 14-3. Terron Ward scored his first of two touch-

downs on a 1-yard rush with 7:53 remaining in the first quarter to put the Beavers up 7-0. Ward scored his second on another 1-yard rush six minutes into the fourth quarter that put OSU up 49-10. **Storm Woods** and **Richard Mullaney** caught the third and fourth touchdown passes of the game by Mannion, both coming in the third quarter. Woods' came on a 28-yarder while Mullaney's, which was less than three minutes after Cal's first score of the game, came from 15 yards out.

The Beavers scored more than 40 points for the third consecutive game, a program first.



**CORVALLIS, Ore.** — No. 25 (BCS) Oregon State came within 7 yards of tying No. 6 Stanford, but was unable to score in the closing seconds in a 20-12 loss in front of 44,519 fans at Reser Stadium.

The Beavers tried for the end zone four times with less than 20 seconds remaining, but **Sean Mannion** was unable to connect with an OSU receiver for the game-tying score. His last pass, to **Kevin Cummings**, was batted away at the last second by a Stanford defender to give the Cardinal (7-1 overall, 5-1 Pac-12 Conference) the win.

The game, which was expected to feature two potent offenses, turned into a defensive battle. Oregon State managed 288 yards of total offense, 271 of which came from the arm of Mannion who failed to throw for more than 300 for the first time. He did, however, surpass the 3,000-yard

mark for the season and tossed his school-record 30th touchdown of the season to **Brandin Cooks** in the third quarter.

Stanford, meanwhile, gained 273 yards of total offense, with 185 on the ground. Tyler Gaffney carried the ball 22 times for 145 yards, including 32 yards on a game-winning score in the fourth quarter.

**Trevor Romaine**, who kicked a career-long 50-yard field goal in the second quarter, connected on a 39-yarder with three minutes remaining in the fourth quarter. It was made possible by a Gaffney fumble, which was recovered by the Beavers' **Dylan Wynn** at Stanford's 20-yard line.

The Beavers kicked deep to Stanford, which stalled at its own 35. Cooks took the Cardinal punt and returned it to the Cardinal 43 with 1:30 left. Mannion moved the Beavers to Stanford's 7 on the strength of two catches by Cooks and a pass interference on the Cardinal on a pass to **Richard Mullaney**.

Cooks caught nine passes for 80 yards and one touchdown, which was his school-record 13th of the season. It was also the 21st of his career, also an Oregon State record.

Romaine's 50-yard field goal came with 12:48 remaining in the first quarter. The Cardinal went up 7-3 with a 4-yard rush by Gaffney with seven seconds remaining in the half.

He made it 13-3 in favor of the Cardinal 52 seconds into the second half with a 9-yard touchdown rush.

The Beavers nearly doubled up on Stanford in time of possession, totaling 38:33 to



**CORVALLIS, Ore. - Brandin Cooks** caught six passes for 88 yards and a touchdown and **Terron Ward** rushed for 53 yards on eight carries but the Beavers lost to USC, 31-14.

Cooks' sixth and final reception of the game tied him with James Rodgers (2009) and Markus Wheaton (2012) for the most in a single season at Oregon State with 91.

His six catches also gave him 189 for his career.

The junior caught the Beavers' lone offensive touchdown of the game, connecting on a 27-yarder with **Sean Mannion** at the 9:43 mark of the second quarter.

Down 14-7 after the touchdown strike, the Beavers tied the score just 14 seconds later when **Ryan Murphy** returned a Cody Kessler pass for a touchdown on the junior's third interception of the season. It also marked the Beavers' third "pick six" of the 2013 season.

The Trojans, however, went ahead for good five minutes

later on a 18-yard touchdown rush by Javorious Allen. It was his second of three touchdowns on the night as he rushed for a 52-yarder with 20 seconds remaining in the third quarter after tallying a 9-yard score in the first.

Ward averaged 6.6 yards per carry and his 53 yards were just two shy of his season-best 55 against Colorado.

Mannion finished the game 26-of-45 for 277 yards and one touchdown. His touchdown strike to Cooks in the second quarter was his 31st of the season.



TEMPE, Ariz. – Brandin Cooks caught nine passes in Oregon State's 30-17 loss to Arizona State at Sun Devil Stadium. By doing so, the junior surpassed Mike Hass and Markus Wheaton as the new Oregon State record holder for receptions in a single-season.

Cooks' 92nd reception came in the first quarter, and went for 4 yards. He went into the following game against Washington sitting at 100, which was tied with California's Dameane Douglas (1998) for fourth-most by a Pac-12 Conference player.

Cooks stood at 198 receptions for his career and was primed to become the fifth Beaver in school history with 200 or more, joining Mike Hass, Markus Wheaton, James Rodgers and James Newson.

The Beavers (6-4 overall, 4-3 Pac-12) outscored Arizona State, which was ranked 19th in the BCS polls, 14-10 in the second half but the Sun Devils went into the intermission with a 20-3 advantage.



Sean Mannion led a 12-play drive late in the third quarter that culminated in a 6-yard touchdown pass to Caleb Smith. The Sun Devils (8-2, 6-1), however, went ahead 23-10 on a Zane Gonzalez field goal with 5:25 remaining in the fourth quarter.

ASU stretched its lead to 30-10 when Robert Nelson picked off Mannion on the next play from scrimmage for a 23-yard touchdown.

The Beavers pulled to within 30-17 when Mannion found

Connor Hamlett for a 29-yard touchdown pass with less than three minutes to play. Hamlett ended the game with a career-best nine receptions for 119 yards.

Mannion ended the game 31-of-46 for 320 yards and two touchdowns. His counterpart, Taylor Kelly, was 22-of-37 for 183 yards and two interceptions.

Oregon State out-gained the Sun Devils, 390 to 339,

Rashaad Reynolds and Jabral Johnson came up with those interceptions in the first half.

Marion Grice carried the ball 23 times for 115 yards to pace Arizona State. He ran for two 1-yard scores; the first came with 11:57 remaining in the first and the second was in the second quarter, at the 8:22 mark.

Tyreek Zimmerman led the Beavers defensively with 11 tackles, including 10 solo.

D.J. Alexander finished with 10 tackles, including half for a loss.

Scott Crichton recorded two sacks to lead OSU.

Scott Crichton (95, below) recorded two sacks against the Sun Devils. Connor Hamlett (89, right) had a career day with nine receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown.

**CORVALLIS, Ore. — Brandin Cooks** caught 10 passes for 117 yards to lead Oregon State in a 69-27 loss to Washington at Reser Stadium.

Cooks extended his school-record for receptions in a single season to 110 while his 117 yards receiving pushed him past Mike Hass (2005) for the most by an Oregon State player with 1,560. His record-breaking reception came on a 29-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter.

His 110 receptions pushed him into third place in the Pac-12 Conference record books, and now trails only Marqise Lee (118 in 2012) and Robert Woods (111 in 2011), both from USC. Cooks' 1,560 yards receiving moved him into second place, trailing only Lee's 1,721 last season.

Cooks also became the fourth player in Oregon State history to catch more than 200 passes in a career and stood at 208, good for fifth. His 3,102 surpassed Markus Wheaton for third in a career.


**Sean Mannion** finished the game with 229 yards passing while completing 20 of his 41 passes attempted. His counterpart, **Cyler Miles**, completed 15-of-24 passes for 162 yards and one touchdown.

Washington running back **Bishop Sankey** carried the ball 23 times for 179 yards and three touchdowns. He scored twice in the first half, guiding the Huskies to a 27-0 lead at halftime. He added a third score six minutes into the third quarter.

**D.J. Alexander** and

**Rommel Mageo** led the Beavers defensively. Both had 10 tackles to tie for the team lead.

The Beavers honored 17 seniors prior to the game.



EUGENE, Ore. — With 10 receptions, **Brandin Cooks** set the Pac-12 Conference's single season record with 120, breaking Marqise Lee's record of 118 set in 2012.

Oregon's Marcus Mariota threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Josh Huff with 29 seconds left and No. 12 Oregon (10-2, 7-2 Pac-12) overcame a tenacious effort by Oregon State 36-35 in the 117th edition of the Civil War rivalry.

With the Ducks holding a 24-23 lead, the Beavers scored on **Sean Mannion's** 4-yard pass to **Tyler Anderson** to pull in front 29-24 early in the fourth quarter. But Oregon answered with Mariota's fourth-and-11 pass to Huff for a 12-yard touchdown and the Ducks took a 30-29 lead with 7:56 left in the game.

**Victor Bolden** ran for a 25-yard touchdown to make it 35-30 for the Beavers with 1:38 remaining, but Oregon State's defense couldn't stop the Ducks on their final drive.

Mannion passed for 314 yards and two touchdowns for the Beavers (6-6, 4-5), while Cooks tallied 110 yards receiving.

**Terron Ward** finished with 145 rushing yards., making him the first 100-yard rusher for Oregon State for the season. As a team, the Beavers recorded 231 yards on the ground, a season high.

Storm Woods scored on a 2-yard run for the Beavers to make it 14-7. **Trevor Romaine** added an 18-yard field goal with 2:33 left in the first half. The Beavers got close again before the break, but Mannion's pass to Cooks was fumbled into the end zone for a touchback.

**Rashaad Reynolds** intercepted Mariota on Oregon's ensuing drive and the Beavers went on to score on Mannion's 6-yard pass to Ward to make it 17-17 at halftime.

Mariota had not thrown an interception this season until he had two in a loss to Arizona the previous week. He had two more interceptions in the first half against the Beavers.

Oregon State pulled in front 20-17 on Romaine's 47-yard field goal to open the second half.


But on the next drive Mariota took off on a 21-yard run, before finding Josh Huff with a 28-yard touchdown pass to retake the lead.

Ward slipped on the turf on fourth-and-1 on the Oregon 5 and the Beavers missed a key opportunity to go back ahead. But they closed to 24-23 early in the fourth quarter on Romaine's 37-yard field goal.

Oregon State rushed for 231 yards including Terron Ward's (28, below) 145. Ward scored on a pass from Sean Mannion just before halftime. Scott Crichton (95, right) tallied six tackles including two tackles-for-loss.

**HONOLULU, Hawai'i — Rashaad Reynolds** returned two fumbles for touchdowns and the Oregon State offense racked up 454 yards to pace the Beavers to a 38-23 win over Boise State at the 2013 Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl.


The Beavers took the early lead taking a 31-6 advantage into halftime. That was due in large part to the Beavers' defense, which forced two fumbles. Both were returned by Reynolds, who, in his last collegiate game, collected 10 tackles amongst the two fumble returns.

The first fumble return came with OSU up 10-3 in the first quarter after a touchdown reception by **Brandin Cooks** and field goal by **Trevor Romaine**. **Scott Crichton** sacked Boise State quarterback Grant Hedrick, forcing a fumble, which enabled Reynolds to pick the ball up at the Broncos' 3-yard line and make it to the end zone with ease, upping the Beavers' lead to 17-3.

Reynolds scored the game's next touchdown, and in grand fashion, returning the Boise State fumble 70 yards. With the Broncos driving, cornerback **Larry Scott** forced a fumble from Troy Ware after a short pass. Reynolds picked it up and had a clear path to the end zone.

That momentum carried over to the Oregon State offense, which scored its next two — and final — touchdowns on the ground. The first came on a 9-yard carry from **Terron Ward**. It came with 2:46 left in the first half and sent OSU to the 25-point lead at the break.

A little more than seven minutes into the second half, the OSU offense picked up where it left off as **Storm Woods** carried



the ball into the end zone from 5 yards out.

Woods stood out offensively for the Beavers, collecting 107 yards on the ground via 16 carries. He paced the Beavers' ground game, which totaled 195 yards overall.

**Sean Mannion** passed for 259 yards, with 60 going to Cooks, who reached that figure by way of eight catches. He finished the season with a Pac-12 Conference record 128 receptions as well as 1,730 yards, surpassing USC's Marquise Lee in both categories.

Mannion's 259 passing yards gave him 4,662 for the season, surpassing Washington's Cody Pickett for the most in a single-year by a Pac-12 quarterback. He also tossed 37 touchdowns in 2013, tied for the third-most with Andrew Luck.

Rashaad Reynolds (below) returned two fumbles for touchdowns and was named the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl MVP. Storm Woods (24, right) rushed for 118 yards and two touchdowns in the bowl win.
